**Media Release:** On 10/12/24 at about 6:45pm Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department received a report of a stabbing occurring in the 100 block of W. Franklin St. An officer was in the area of N. Prospect and Church Streets at the time and saw a male chasing another male. One of the males, later identified as Kevin Leonard Quander, was holding a knife and swinging it at the victim. As the officer was getting out of his patrol car, he saw Quander make another slashing motion towards the victim’s neck. The officer ordered Quander to drop the knife but he refused the officer’s commands, stating he wanted the officers to kill him, and began running in the 100 block of N. Jonthan St.

Officers pursued Quander on foot and utilized a Conducted Electronic Weapon (Taser) to gain compliance. The suspect continued to struggle but officers were able to get him into custody. Other officers were directed to the victim’s location to administer first aid. The victim suffered from 3 stab wounds to the upper back and neck area. He was transported to Mertitus Medical Center for treatment for non-life threatening injuries. Kevin Quander, age 40 of Hagerstown, was charged with the following: 1st & 2nd Degree Attempted Murder; 1st & 2nd Degree Assault; Reckless Endangerment.

We are grateful for the quick actions of the officers on scene, de-escalating a situation that could have easily become deadly. We are also thankful for the officers that were able to render first aid prior to Emergency Medical Services arriving on scene.


**Officer of the Month:** Officers Huff and Woody have both been nominated as Officers of the Month for September. They were conducting surveillance when a bicyclist passed by at Washington and Cannon Ave. After observing traffic violations Officer Huff attempted to initiate a traffic stop. The bicyclist fled, ditching the bike and running on foot. After a short foot chase the suspect threw a 1911 style pistol in a storm drain and was tackled by Officer Woody. Officer Huff arrived and they were able to handcuff him. The suspect was in possession of a KelTec AR pistol, over 700 pressed fentanyl pills, and around \$450 in currency in addition to the pistol he threw in the storm drain. Officers Huff and Woody took a dangerous armed drug dealer of the city streets. We are grateful for their efforts and the safe outcome of this arrest. Congratulations to Officer Huff and Officer Woody for a job well done.






