Economic Development

It is Economic Development Week in Maryland from Oct.21-25. The City of Hagerstown DCED is celebrating with a proclamation on Tuesday, Oct. 22; business appreciation visits on Wed. Oct. 23 & Fri. Oct. 25, and with a social media blitz highlighting economic development achievements in the City of Hagerstown. Also, on Friday, Oct. 25, everyone is encouraged to wear their favorite Hagerstown-based business merchandise or swag to show your support for businesses in Hagerstown, Maryland.

DCED staff hosted the Ways and Means committee of the General Assembly at Meritus Park providing an update on economic development of the downtown. The committee also toured some of the downtown recent developments to show how state funded projects are impacting redevelopment of the City's core.

Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations

On Monday, Oct. 21 at 11am Plant the Seeds of Maryland Homecare celebrated their Grand Opening. Located at 22 N. Mulberry St., Suite 125, this company provides in-home round-the-clock care service to seniors in need, plus the provision of monthly care baskets.

On Monday, Oct. 21 at 1pm Baile Cask & Kettle, "Baile Bagels & Brews" celebrated the Grand Opening of this quick-service bagel shop and microbrewery with an Irish-American themed restaurant at 53 W. Washington St. in the newly renovated Updegraff building. They are open 7 days a week from 6am-10pm.

ENGINEERING

1. **Dual Highway Safety Demonstration Project** – staff made a final presentation to Smart Growth America on the installation of speed cushions and other traffic calming features on Dual Highway. The State Highway Administration will be removing the cushions and some of the other features in mid-November, and will evaluate whether to reinstall as permanent improvements.
2. **Clara Barton Memorial** – red paver bricks, with donors names, were installed in the shape of a cross in front of the statue. During the week of November 11th granite markers with bronze plaques will be installed on the south side of the site.
3. **Electronics Recycling Event** – staff is working with Waste Management to prepare for the annual electronics recycling event, which will be held at Fairgrounds Park on November 2nd. The event is free to City residents to dispose of electronic devices and to have papers securely shredded.

Significant Incidents

10/19/24 – *Working House Fire w/ Rescue* – Engine 4, Truck 4, and Special Unit 3-2 responded to 236 Prospect Avenue for a smoke alarm sounding. Shortly after, dispatch began receiving additional calls and upgraded the assignment to a house fire. Special Unit 3-2 arrived to find a row house with heavy smoke evident and an occupant trapped on a roof/overhang area. Additional units began to arrive and the occupant was quickly rescued using ladders. Simultaneously, hoselines were stretched to extinguish fire in two homes in the row. Once the bulk of the fire was knocked down, crews checked additional units for extension. The fire marshal's office is investigating the cause. One occupant was transported to the hospital for smoke inhalation.

Trick or Treat: On Thursday, HPD participated in the Drive Through Trick or Treat event at Fairgrounds Park coordinated by Parks & Recreation. Our officers were happy to see all the families and even met some future officers!

Media Releases:

Franklin Street: On 10/22/24 at about 11:15am Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the 7 Star Mini Mart located at 200 W. Franklin St for a report of shots fired. On arrival, officers made contact with two females who stated they had been struck by a vehicle pulling into the parking lot. Investigation revealed that a Toyota Camry pulled in and struck the two females. A male that was with the women at the time produced a handgun and fired one shot towards the driver of the Toyota Camry. The driver of the Toyota fled the scene in the vehicle and the male shooter fled on foot. During the investigation it was discovered that a separate, uninvolved vehicle on the parking lot was struck by the gunfire. Officers began tracking the shooter's movements with city surveillance video but were unable to determine his last location. They were however able to positively identify him based on the video footage. Though the investigation officers and detectives learned he was in a vehicle. He was subsequently pulled over in that vehicle in the 100 block of N. Potomac St. and was placed under arrest without incident at about 2:00pm



There are various details we are not releasing at this time, including the name of the shooting suspect. We anticipate he will be charged later this evening and when appropriate we will release identifying information. This is an ongoing investigation and there will be no further information released at this time.

Franklin Street Update - 10/23/2024: The shooting suspect in this case is identified as 20-year-old John Michael Matthews-Hackett, of Hagerstown. During the course of the investigation, it was learned that Matthews-Hackett was only next to the women by happenstance and they were unknown to each other. The women had been in an altercation with the driver of the Toyota moments before. The driver then struck the women with the bumper of his vehicle before fleeing. Matthews-Hackett who was standing near where the women were struck, produced a handgun, firing a round. Neither woman required medical attention. This is still an ongoing investigation as it relates to the driver of the striking vehicle.

Matthews-Hackett has been charged with: 1st & 2nd degree attempted murder; 1st & 2nd degree assault; Reckless endangerment; Numerous handgun violations.


Antietam Street – 10/23/2024: On Wednesday morning at about 11:00am an Officer with the Hagerstown Police Department was doing foot patrol in the unit block of E. Antietam St. The officer approached a group of people to the rear of 58 E. Antietam St. The officer attempted to approach one of the individuals and as he did, the male fled on foot. The suspect ran through backyards and jumped fences. Unfortunately, officers were not able to find the suspect but they did find the cross-body bag he had been wearing. The suspect threw down the bag as he fled. Officers recovered it and found a fully loaded Taurus 9mm handgun. Officers are working on identifying the suspect and this is an open case. Great proactive work by our officers and another gun is off the streets. The next goal is to get the suspect in custody.




A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
