DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Economic Development

Nebraska Congressman, Mike Flood, and a team of Nebraska-area housing advocates traveled to Hagerstown Mon. Nov. 18 to tour Kilpatrick Woods housing development being built in the West end of Hagerstown. This development of homes is among the first in the nation to create opportunities for new workforce housing through streamlining building costs through manufactured housing.

Representatives from federal housing agencies such as Freddie Mac and the Federal Housing Finance Agency were present as well. The tour provided valuable insights into workforce housing homeownership development.

Community Development

The Hagerstown Youth Council hosted Matthew Ranieli, president of the Rotary Club of Hagerstown to speak with the council about club's involvement in community service, and their upcoming 'Four-Way Speech Test' competition!

Department Representation at Events

- Economic Development staff attending luncheon with Maryland Secretary of Commerce, presented by Leadership Washington County at the USMH Hospitality Center on Thurs. Nov. 21.
- Staff attended the 22nd Annual Economic Summit sponsored by the Washington County Chamber of Commerce, held at Fountain Head on Wed. Nov. 20. Renowned Economist, Dr. Anirban Basu, shared insights on the state of the economy, diving into global, national, and local economics.

ENGINEERING

1. **Greater Hagerstown Committee** – staff attended the meeting of the GHC transportation sub-forum and discussed the results of the Consolidated Transportation Plan tour. Nearly every local representative at the meeting told the Secretary of Transportation that the widening of Interstate 81 is our top priority.
2. **Wheaton Park Phase II Improvements** – staff met onsite with the natural play equipment vendor to discuss the exact layout of the play area. The architect also submitted 95% plans for the stage; we hope to advertise this project for bids in December.
3. **Hagerstown Field House** – the contractor has paved the northern parking lot, and is preparing to turn on the rooftop HVAC units to condition the building. Once the building is conditioned, the sports flooring and the artificial turf can be installed.

Media Releases:

11/20/2024: On 11/20/22, at about 11:45am officers responded to the area of the YMCA on Eastern Blvd for multiple reports of shots fired. At the time staff was outside on the playground with children of the daycare. Staff immediately moved to make the children safe and then got them inside. YMCA staff then locked down their facility.

The callers were able to tell us that the shots were coming from the area of Courtland Manor towards the YMCA. Responding officers located shell casings outside one of the buildings, were able to identify which apartment they came from and made contact with the residents. Two adult males are currently in custody and being questioned by investigators. Thankfully, no one was injured in this incident. The investigation is ongoing and we are coordinating with the State's Attorney's Office on potential charges. There is no further information to be released at this time

Updated Release 11/18/2024: On 11/17/24, officers located and identified the suspect in the 11/15/24 shooting incident which occurred in the 200 block of W. Franklin St. He is identified as 38-year-old Antonio Jefferson of Ft. Pierce, FL. Jefferson was located in the 400 block of Jonathan Street and at the time of his arrest was in possession of cocaine. He is charged with Possession with Intent to Distribute. Charges for the shooting incident are pending the completion of the necessary paperwork.

Community Engagement: HPD was honored to assist the U.S. Forest Service crew with security during the visit of the U.S. Capitol Christmas Tree on Wednesday. HPD escorted the Tree Team from I-81 to the Downtown for the special appearance and then escorted them to a secure location for the evening until the departure to their next destination.






A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
