Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations

On Wednesday, December 11th, Jamison Door Company celebrated the grand reopening of the company’s historic Hagerstown manufacturing headquarters at 55 J.V. Jamison Drive. For the last 118 years, Jamison has earned a global reputation for exceptional quality craftsmanship and innovative door solutions. The recent \$700,000 expansion includes a state-of-the-art showroom, updated office area, and canteen breakroom for a dedicated team of 105 employees. Mayor, Bill McIntire, presented an official Special Recognition on behalf of the City of Hagerstown to BMP parent company CEO, Danilo Benotti, and Jamison Door Company CEO, Dwight Clark.

ENGINEERING

1. Hagerstown Field House – on the interior, flooring is being installed in the weight room, and the casework for the front desk is being installed; kitchen equipment is being hooked up and tested. On the exterior, the contractor is installing base pavement and landscaping at various locations.
2. Comcast fiber optic – staff met with Comcast subcontractors to discuss the installation of fiber optic cable in Northern Avenue. Due to issues with the existing utility poles along the road, Comcast plans to microtrench the pavement for the installation.
3. Safety Action Plan – staff continues to work with the HEPMPO consultant team to complete the SS4A Action Plan. The team is identifying the corridors that meet the criteria of High Injury Network designation, and is working toward having a draft action plan ready to release for public comment in February.

Significant Incidents

12/12/24 @ 9:30 am: There is currently police activity in the 100 block of W Bethel St. We are investigating a serious accident. The road will be closed, please avoid the area. Updates will be provided as appropriate
Update on 12/12/24 @ 12:45 pm. The roadway has been reopened. The investigation into the collision is ongoing. We can report that one adult male was transported to Meritus Medical Center with life threatening injuries.

Update 12/12/24 @ 1:50 pm. At about 9:03 am, officers responded to the 100 block of W. Bethel St for a bicyclist struck by a vehicle. The bicyclist, an adult male, suffered life threatening injuries and was transported to MMC where he remains in critical condition. The driver of the vehicle did not remain on scene but was located by officers a short distance away. He was brought to police headquarters for questioning. Video surveillance footage in the 100 block of W. Bethel shows that the bicyclist entered onto the roadway, crossing from south to north. W. Bethel is a one-way street and the vehicle was traveling eastbound. An accident reconstruction officer arrived on scene to investigate and is coordinating with the State’s Attorneys Office during the investigation. At this time will not be releasing any identifying information regarding the parties involved.

Officer of the Month: Ofc. Kelbaugh has been selected as Officer of the Month for his arrest of an attempted murder suspect. Officers Kelbaugh and Mull were patrolling in the area of Randolph Ave when they saw the suspect. They attempted to approach him, and he fled on foot. Ofc Kelbaugh chased the suspect who briefly got out of his sight. As Ofc. Kelbaugh rounded a corner he located the suspect again. The suspect was armed with a handgun and dropped it to the ground and continued to flee. Ofc. Kelbaugh was able to get a hold of the suspect in an attempt to place him under arrest. The suspect fought with Ofc. Kelbaugh for several minutes until Ofc. Mull was able to determine their location and assist with the arrest.

Ofc. Kelbaugh displayed bravery and strength during this incident. He is to be commended for his actions in what could have been a deadly situation. Congratulations of Ofc. Kelbaugh on being selected as November Officer of the Month.






A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
