## ENGINEERING

1. **Intersection improvements** – the contractor has begun demolition at the Summit Avenue/Antietam Street intersection, and is excavating for the new traffic signal pole foundation on Summit Avenue. We hope to have the work on the east side of the intersection completed prior to the opening day for the Flying Boxcars.
2. **Security Road Sidewalks** – the contractor has completed approximately 80% of the new sidewalk installation, and is expected to finish the work within the next two weeks.
3. **Safe Streets for All Safety Action Plan** – the consultant has prepared a draft version of the report, and we plan to publish the report for public comment on April 2<sup>nd</sup>. The report will remain open for comments until May 2<sup>nd</sup>, and staff intends to take the report to the City Council for approval at the end of May.

### Significant Incidents

3/17/25 - *Working House Fire* – HFD units were dispatched to 731 W Washington St for a reported house fire. **Academy:** The Hagerstown Police Department offers police officer testing several times throughout the year. The next test date for police officer and police cadet applicants will be Saturday, March 22, 2025. **Officer of the Month:** Detective Nick Varner has been selected for “Officer of the Month” relating to the homicide investigation that took place on Wednesday February 12, 2025. The victim was shot and killed inside 218 West Franklin Street and the suspect fled out of the rear of the residence. Det. Varner immediately navigated to the city surveillance cameras and began reviewing individuals in the area at the time of the shooting.

Det. Varner quickly identified the suspect leaving the rear of the residence just after the shooting. Det. Varner was able to track the suspect to the 100 Block West Franklin Street where it was determined the suspect changed clothes. Officers were able to locate clothing in the hallway that was associated with two females that the suspect fled with. Det. Varner tracked the suspect to the first block of East Washington Street where he observed him getting into a vehicle and leave the area. Det. Varner was able to identify the registered owner and their current address which was in the 200 block of Wakefield Road. Officers responded to the area and observed two males exit the vehicle and walk into the residence of the registered owners. Officers made contact with several individuals who were inside the residence and ultimately took the suspect into custody. The suspect had been in the process of shaving his head and face to change his appearance.

From the time of the initial 911 call to when the suspect was taken into custody was three hours and thirteen minutes. It is rare for a homicide suspect to be identified and taken into custody in such a short period of time, aside from a suspect turning themselves into law enforcement.

Over the past seven years Det. Varner has built a robust camera system, not only in the downtown, but now throughout areas of the city that he has identified as being targeted crime areas. There are over 600 high-definition cameras throughout the city that are routinely used to solve crimes from homicides to tampering with motor vehicles. Det. Varner has launched a camera system that once was a "bonus" when investigating a crime, to now an expectation from the State's Attorney's Office and Defense Attorney's. Though this is one high profile case in the last 30 days, Det. Varner and the camera system are relied on daily and sometimes hourly.



Altman, for his extensive investigation and arrest for theft of a dump trailer; Ofc. Larrain, for his vigilance in a high-risk pursuit and apprehension of a subject with a handgun and CDS. Our officers continue to do great work every day and we are pleased to recognize all these officers.




## A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

### AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Tuesday, March 11, 2025 @ 8:55PM: Supervisor on call received a call from the parking deck attendant at the University Parking Deck that the fire alarm was activated for an unknown reason. Staff notified dispatch and then reported to site. It was determined that a pull station was activated resulting in a false alarm. The deck attendant was able to review camera footage and observe the guilty party activate the alarm; the footage was provided to the Fire Marshall's office.

Saturday, March 15, 2025 @ 9:50AM: Dispatch notified Staff of a missing storm drain lid at 1313 Salem Ave. The Supervisor visited the site and met with responsible party at drain. In an attempt to recover items in drain they were unable to replace lid correctly which resulted in lid falling into drain. Public Works staff was called in to retrieve and reset lid properly.

Sunday, March 16, 2025 @ 4:30PM: Dispatch notified Staff of the intersection at W. Washington St. and Buena Vista and Devonshire Roads being completely out. When the Supervisor went to investigate HLD was onsite and restoring power to intersection. The Supervisor observed intersection and confirmed all facets were operating normally.

Sunday, March 16, 2025 @ 7:45PM: Staff was notified by a neighbor who reported that a nearby lightning strike had placed the intersection of Pennsylvania Ave. and Burhans Blvd. into flash. Supervisor arrived on site and after a cursory check it became apparent that the cabinet and internal components had received a direct strike from the lightning storm. Signal personnel was able to identify the damaged parts and replace thus restoring the intersection to normal operations.
