Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations

Celebrating the Grand Opening of Eliza's House, located at 25 E. Franklin Street on Friday, April 11 at 11am. Eliza's House, founded in January 2025, supports marginalized individuals and women with breast cancer. This non-profit organization offers transformative support and resources, including a community bookstore, aiming to provide a safe space for healing and empowerment.

ENGINEERING

1. **Pavement Preservation Program** – the City's contractor, Craig Paving, has begun working on this year's list of streets to be milled and overlaid. Noland Drive is one of the first streets where they are working, along with patches at various locations around the City.

2. **Intersection Improvements** – the contractor continues to work on the demolition and replacement of curbs and sidewalks at the Summit Avenue/Antietam Street intersection in advance of the installation of the new traffic signal. A significant amount of rock has been encountered, which has slowed production.
3. **Safe Streets for All Action Plan** – staff reviewed the draft Action Plan with the Board of Traffic and Parking. The plan is open for public comment until May 2nd; staff plans to bring the final plan to the City Council at a work session in May. A public meeting to discuss the plan will be held at 5:00 PM on April 23rd at the Washington County Free Library.






A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY
