ENGINEERING

1. **Storm Damage** – staff assisted with assessment and property inspections following the wind storm on April 19th. One building was condemned due to damage, and several other buildings were inspected after roof or façade damage was identified. Staff is continuing to aid in mapping and quantifying damage caused by the storm, and is supporting other departments in the cleanup efforts.
2. **Security Road sidewalks** – the project is substantially complete; the contractor needs to complete work at the entrance to the Ice & Sports Complex, and perform final cleanup activities.
3. **Pavement Preservation program** – the City’s contractor will be continuing the milling and repaving of streets that are on the overlay list. Work has been completed on Noland Drive, and work over the next two weeks includes Michigan Avenue, Devonshire Road, and The Terrace.

Incidents

4/16/25 – *Commercial Vehicle Fire* – HFD units responded for a reported commercial vehicle fire on Omega Drive. Engine 3 arrived to find a paper-shredder truck with a fire in the compartment holding the shreds. Engine 3 supplied the on-board sprinkler system to extinguish the fire before opening up to check for extension.

4/19/25 – *Significant Weather Event* – On Saturday 4/19, HFD responded to over 100 incidents after a powerful storm hit the Hagerstown area. A large portion of these incidents included power lines/trees down and structural damage from wind.

4/19/25 – *Working House Fire* – During the heaviest part of the storm, HFD also handled a working house fire at 24 W Bethel St. Crews arrived to find fire evident from multiple windows on the upper floors. Hose lines were quickly deployed and the fire was held to the 2nd floor and attic area. Searches were completed and no occupants were found inside. No injuries reported.

MEDIA RELEASES:

4/18/2025: On 4/18/2025 around 6:30 pm, officers located Derrell Frisby (age 23 of Hagerstown) at the Wheaton Park basketball courts. Frisby had multiple active felony warrants. As officers attempted to contact him, Frisby tried to flee the area on foot. After a brief foot pursuit, he was taken into custody in the area of Sumans Ave and Susan Ave. Frisby resisted arrest and drew a handgun from his waistband. Officers were able to contain him, secure the handgun and take him into custody. Officers moved Frisby to a nearby patrol car and administered his inhaler. He was checked on scene by Community Rescue Services and transported to Meritus Medical Center as a precaution. The handgun in Frisby's possession was reported stolen. Frisby will be transported to the Washington County Detention Center where his arrest warrants will be served. In addition, he will be charged with numerous handgun charges and resisting arrest. We are grateful for the work our officers do, especially in a dangerous situation involving a fully loaded handgun.

4/23/2025: On Wednesday, April 23rd at about 2:40 pm, Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the 900 block of Potomac Ave for a report of a pedestrian struck by a vehicle. On arrival, officers determined the driver of a 2017 Lexus sport utility vehicle was traveling northbound, left the roadway and struck a pedestrian. The pedestrian, later identified as 55-year-old Albert Scibilia of Hagerstown, had been standing near his parked vehicle, a 2015 Ford F-150 with an attached trailer. The driver of the Lexus, a 39-year-old female from Hagerstown, struck the trailer and Mr. Scibilia. The victim was pronounced deceased at the scene. The driver of the Lexus was taken to Meritus Medical Center and treated for non-life-threatening injuries.

The Hagerstown Police Department Crash Reconstruction Team was called to the scene. The investigation is ongoing. The results of the investigation will be released to the Washington County State’s Attorney’s Office for review and determination of any applicable charges. The name of the driver will be withheld pending the review of the investigation by the State’s Attorney’s Office.

March Officer of the Month: Officer Kelbaugh has been selected for the month of March for the proactive work which resulted in three handgun arrests and a large amount of CDS removed from the community. Below is a summary of his work.

- Officer Kelbaugh conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle and recovered one stolen loaded handgun and a large amount of cocaine and fentanyl from the vehicle.
- Officer Kelbaugh conducted surveillance in the area of the 7 Star Mini Mart. He later conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle leaving the area and located one loaded handgun inside the vehicle.
- Officer Kelbaugh responded to a large group of vehicles playing loud music. Upon Officer Kelbaugh’s arrival, one vehicle began to drive out of the area without its headlights on. Officer Kelbaugh conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and recovered one loaded handgun from the vehicle.

Officer Kelbaugh’s proactive policing has made a positive impact in our community and likely prevented violent crime. We are proud of his work and happy to recognize him for his exemplary service in the month of March.

In addition, there were four other nominations including: Officers Howard, Boyle & Ward, Yontz & Miscannon, and Det. Weaver. We are proud of the work our officers are doing day in and day out.






A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Friday April 18, 2025 @ 4:00PM: Staff was notified of a tripped alarm at 32 N. Potomac, Customer Service facilities. The supervisor found the rear door unlocked and conducted a walk through with HPD. Staff made sure all stairway doors were locked and secure, locked rear door and reset the alarm.

Saturday, April 19, 2025 @ 11:15PM: On Saturday, April 19, 2025, a fast-moving micro-burst storm struck the area with winds reaching 75 MPH. The high winds were very brief (10 – 15 minutes) but powerful enough to blow off roofs and topple dozens of trees. A small crew of staff came in late Saturday night clearing the streets of fallen trees. Streets affected included E. Franklin St., E. Washington St., W. Washington Ave., Pangborn Blvd., Burhans Blvd. along with several others. Staff returned on Sunday, April 20, 2025, to continue to clear streets and repair a dozen traffic signal heads broken from the high winds. Many street signs were also repaired or replaced due to high winds and fallen trees. Public Works staff did an outstanding job of getting the streets opened for emergency services as well as the general public.

Parks staff were also in on Sunday to assess the damage to the 22 parks and playgrounds including the golf course. Pangborn Park and The Greens at Hamilton Run Golf Course took the brunt of the storm. No major damage but plenty of damaged trees and the golf course was littered with limbs throughout the site. The course was closed until the area could be cleared.

Sunday, April 20, 2025 @ 10AM: Parking staff was called in to check on all decks in the aftermath of the storm and raise the gates.
