Media Release:

April 27, 2025: At about 1:30 pm officers responded to the 300 block of S. Locust St for a report of an assault involving a knife. Officers were on scene in under a minute of the call being dispatched. On arrival they learned that an adult female had been cut on the neck and arm by her boyfriend. The assault occurred inside a residence. She was transported to Meritus Medical Center with non life threatening injuries. Using city surveillance cameras, officers were able to locate the suspect in the area of S. Locust and E. Antietam St. where he was placed under arrest at 1:45 pm. He is an adult male, 42 years of age. His name will be released when he is officially charged.

Update: Aisheem Rashad Yarberough has been charged with: 1st Degree assault; 2nd Degree assault; Reckless Endangerment. We are grateful for the quick response of our officers and that the woman involved was not more seriously injured.

Accreditation: The Hagerstown Police Department received its tenth consecutive accreditation award from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA). Since our last award in 2021, CALEA has conducted annual web-based reviews of HPD’s policies and practices to verify continuing compliance with 366 applicable standards. From October 20 through 24, 2024, a CALEA assessor conducted a site-based review, interviewing forty-one individuals from both inside and outside the department to further verify the findings of the web-based reviews. The CALEA reviews culminated in HPD’s most recent reaccreditation.

CALEA Accreditation is a voluntary process. Participating public safety agencies, by involvement, have demonstrated a commitment to professionalism. The program is intended to enhance organization service capacities and effectiveness, serve as a tool for policy decisions and management, promote transparency and community trust, and establish a platform for continuous review. Currently, 799 of the approximately 18,000 law enforcement agencies in the U.S. are accredited through CALEA.

Academy: HPD is hiring for the October 2025 police academy. Testing dates for the fall academy are set for Saturday, May 17th at 8:00 am and Thursday, June 12th at 6:00 pm at the Public Safety Training Center. 




A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY






A&E PARKING DECK WEEKLY OCCUPANCY

AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Friday, May 2, 2025 @ 4:15 PM: Public Works office received a call from a concerned resident on Mealey Pkwy regarding a broken off limb hanging in a street tree. Supervisor on call went to site for an assessment and found limb broken off but wedged tightly in the tree. No immediate safety concern existed, and the limb was removed the next business day.

Saturday, May 3, 2025 @ 9:15PM: Dispatch notified supervisor of the signal being in flash at N. Prospect St. and Church St. Staff verified flash mode and called in a signal technician who reset the signal. While en route back to the shop the technician discovered the signal at Wilson Blvd. and Maryland Ave. also in flash and reset this signal as well. Both signals then worked properly.

Sunday, May 4, 2025 @ 8:45AM: A resident left a voicemail that the 1000 block of Brinker Drive was flooded. A maintenance worker was called in to clear the debris from the storm drain and allow the water to drain away.

Sunday, May 4, 2025 @ 6:45PM: Staff was notified of a speed limit sign knocked down and the pole posing a potential hazard at 953 Mulberry Ave. Once on site, the pole was found bent over and loose from the ground and the sign itself missing. Staff removed the pole and brought it to the shop.


