ENGINEERING

1. **Construction Contracts** – staff opened bids for the FY 26 curb & sidewalk replacement contract, the FY 26 handicap ramp contract, and the Burnap parking lot reconstruction at City Park.
2. **City Hall 1st Floor Renovations** – the contractor is working on finalizing the HVAC installation, and is finishing painting and trim work in various areas. It is expected that the project will be substantially complete in early June.
3. **Department of Health Walk Audit** – staff participated in a meeting with the Washington County Health Department to discuss a project for which they have received funding through the Safe Routes to School program. The project will focus on assessing walk routes to South High and Bester Elementary School.

Incidents

5/10/25 – *Working Shed Fire* – HFD units were alerted for a reported structure fire in the area of 44 Water St. Engine 4 arrived to find a shed fully involved in fire. After ensuring there were no occupants in the shed, Engine 4 made a quick knock and had the fire under control within about a minute. The incident was scaled back and turned over to the fire marshal’s office, no injuries were reported.

5/11/25 – *Carbon Monoxide Hazard* – HFD units responded to Lindsey Lane for a CO alarm sounding. Crews arrived to find the residence evacuated and an active CO alarm inside. Crews found carbon monoxide readings at a hazardous level throughout the residence and narrowed the source to the fireplace. Once the source was controlled, the residence was ventilated and occupants could reoccupy.

5/11/25 – *Natural Gas Leak* – HFD units responded to Hurricane Ct for an odor of gas in the residence. Crews arrived and confirmed a strong odor of natural gas with hazardous readings found on gas meters. The source was narrowed down to a utility closet and gas was secured to the building. Ventilation was started and the hazard was mitigated.

AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Tuesday, May 6, 2025 @ 4:25 PM: Dispatch called and reported the intersection of Maryland Ave. at Wilson Blvd. not changing. Supervisor found the S/B straight thru lane was not changing upon arrival at 4:40 PM, all other phases were operating normally. The intersection and S/B straight thru lane on Maryland Avenue returned to normal operation at 5:23 PM. This has been a recurring issue and staff is scheduled to replace the suspect camera on Wednesday 5/7/25 and anticipate this will resolve the issue. The failure did cause a significant back up on the southbound approach to the intersection.

Friday, May 9, 2025 @ 3:30PM: Public Works office received a report for the signal on Baltimore St. at Summit Ave. in active flash. The supervisor on call confirmed flash condition and called a signal technician in for repairs. The technician was able to reset the conflict monitor and place the signal back into normal operation.
