Community Development staff ventured to Baltimore, MD for the Choice Means Choice Conference this week from May 20-22. Choice Means Choice Conference title, The Power of H.O.M.E. Healthy Opportunities Made for Everyone, lends to the department’s work connected with the Choice Neighborhood efforts in our community.

### **Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations**

On Wednesday, May 21 we celebrated the Grand Opening of Hub City Convenience Store at 17 E. Franklin Street. This February, Furrugh Jamil, a local business owner, bought the convenience store at 17 E. Franklin Street. Formerly known as Spickler's, the store has served Hagerstown residents for over 54 years across three generations. To honor this long history, Mr. Jamil has renamed it Hub City Convenience Store, celebrating our city.

# ENGINEERING

1. **Field House Tour** – staff gave a tour of the Hagerstown Field House to the Mayor and City Administrator of Cumberland; they were very impressed with the facility, and are considering the construction of their own facility.
2. **Bid Openings** – we opened bids for the FY 26 Curb & Sidewalk contract, the FY 26 Handicap Ramp contract, and Improvements to the Burnap Parking Lot at City Park. These projects will be forwarded to the Mayor & Council for their consideration and approval.
3. **Pavement Preservation** – the City’s contractor has completed approximately 70% of the street repaving work on this year’s list, and plans to complete the remaining work in June and July.

## Incidents

5/14/25 – *Structural Collapse* – HFD units responded to 32 West Side Ave for a reported structural collapse. Crews arrived to find the stone foundation on one side of the residence had collapsed into the basement. Once it was confirmed there were no injuries, HFD crews secured utilities before turning the scene over to the building inspector.

5/14/25 – *Kitchen Fire* – HFD units responded to 17615 Basalt Way for a reported house fire. Crews arrived to find a kitchen fire that had been successfully extinguished by an activated sprinkler head. Crews ensured there was no extension, secured the sprinkler head, and ventilated the structure.

5/19/25 – *Fire in Apartment Building* – HFD units were alerted in the middle of the night to 56 E Antietam St for a reported apartment building fire. Crews arrived to find smoke showing from a 3-story apartment building. Hoselines were stretched and a fire was located on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. The fire was quickly controlled and extinguished without significant fire spread. Crews ensured the safety of residents of the building and turned the scene over to the fire marshal's office.

## **Media Release:**

Press Release on Behalf of the Washington County Narcotics Task Force.

In the month of May 2025, the Washington County Narcotics Task Force began investigating 1 East Baltimore Street in relation to suspected Controlled Dangerous Substance distribution. Agents with the Washington County Narcotics Task Force identified two apartments that were engaging in the distribution of suspected narcotics. Based on observations, Agents believed that one of the subjects commonly carried a handgun. They obtained a search and seizure warrant for two apartments at this location.

On May 21, 2025 the Washington County Narcotics Task Force executed the search and seizure warrants on the apartments at 1 East Baltimore Street with the assistance of the Washington County Special Response Team, Hagerstown Police Department's Crime Suppression Unit, Hagerstown Police Departments drone operations, Maryland State Police and the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services.

During the search and seizure warrants, Agents recovered a Glock handgun stolen from Virginia Beach that was tossed out of a window, fentanyl, cocaine, paraphernalia, and United States currency. Seven arrests were made in this operation and they are as follows:

27 year old, Montana Anderson from Baltimore, MD was charged with the following: Firearm Possession-Crime; Violent/Felony Conviction; Regulated Firearm: Stolen; Alter Physical/Evidence Crim Proc; CDS: Possession not cannabis

24 year old, Rasheed Galloway-Mccray from Pikesville, MD was charged with the following: Firearm Possession-Crime Violent/Felony Conviction; Regulated Firearm: Stolen; Regulated Firearm: Illegal possession; CDS –Possession of Firearms

22 year old, Christopher Crawford from Pikesville, MD was charged with the following: Possession with intent to Distribute CDS Fentanyl/Heroin; CDS: Possession with intent to Distribute: Narcotic; CDS: Possession with intent to Distribute: Narcotic; 2 counts CDS: Possession not cannabis; Possess contraband-place of confinement

22 year old, Deandre Sneed from Randallstown, MD was charged with the following: CDS possession not cannabis; CDS possession paraphernalia; Sneed was served with a warrant out of Howard County, Maryland for the following: Kidnapping, 1st degree assault, 2nd degree assault, False imprisonment. Sneed was also served with a warrant out of Anne Arundel County, Maryland for the following: Attempted 2nd degree murder, Robbery, Two counts of 1st degree assault, Two counts of 2nd degree assault, Two counts of Reckless endangerment, False imprisonment, Burglary 1st degree, Theft less than \$100

18 year old, Tamika Smith from Hagerstown, MD was charged with the following: CDS possession not cannabis, CDS possession paraphernalia

26 year old, Vivica Smith from Hagerstown, MD was charged with the following: CDS possession not cannabis; CDS possession paraphernalia

Portions of this operation were funded by the Maryland Criminal Intelligence Network (MCIN) which is part of the Governor's Office Crime Prevention and Policy Program. MCIN focuses on identifying, disrupting, and dismantling gangs and violent criminal networks involved in the distribution of illegal drugs, the use of firearms in crimes of violence, human trafficking, or other inherently violent criminal enterprises, through enforcement, prevention, intervention, and information sharing. MCIN seeks to reduce violent crime by facilitating the formation of information technology-enabled partnerships that lead to the improved investigation and prosecution of violent criminals and their networks.
