ENGINEERING & PERMITS

1. **Bester Elementary Walk Routes** – staff participated with the Washington County Health Department in an audit of the sidewalks and walk routes to Bester Elementary and South High. Staff noted defects in the sidewalks and crosswalks at various locations, and will add them to the list for future repair.
2. **Hamilton Run Stream Restoration** – staff, in conjunction with the Washington County Conservation District and the Catoctin Land Trust, are developing plans for a stream restoration project along Northern Avenue near the American Legion. This project, scheduled to go to construction in 2026, will secure credits that will count against the City’s MS4 stormwater permit requirements.
3. **Wheaton Park Improvements** – a portion of the walking trail along Sumans Avenue was repaved in advance of the Juneteenth event scheduled for June 19th. The new Wheaton Park stage project is currently out to bid, and we expect to award that contract in July.

Incidents

5/30/25 – *Vehicle Fire* – Units were dispatched to assist Halfway with a vehicle fire endangering a structure on Manse Road. Engine 1 arrived first and quickly deployed an attack line to control the fire.

6/2/25 – HFD units responded for a reported appliance fire at 90 Manor Drive. Units arrived to find a 3-sty garden apartment building with smoke evident from the top floor. Crews stretched an attack line and found a coffee maker on fire on a stovetop. The fire had been controlled by a stovetop mounted fire suppression cannister with no further extension.

6/4/25 – *Gas Leak* – HFD and Funkstown units were dispatched for a natural gas line rupture on South Edgewood Drive. Units arrived to find a significant leak from a 2” main line that had been struck. Crews assisted Columbia Gas with control and metering of the situation.

6/4/25 – *Transfer* – Engine 1 provided funeral coverage standby for the Clear Spring Volunteer Fire Company. While standing by, they handled several incidents including a water rescue on the Potomac River and a working structure fire on Kemps Mill Road.



6/5/25 – *Building Fire* – HFD units were dispatched with Halfway for a reported restaurant on fire in the area of the Valley Mall. The initial assignment was based off of the fire location to be within the city, but when units arrived, they found a working fire that was within Halfway’s coverage area. City and County crews were able to quickly contain the fire that began on the outside of the building.





AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Tuesday, May 27, 2025 @ 2:40 PM: Report of signal pole knocked down at intersection of W. Franklin St. and N. Jonathan St. Signal technician assisted to secure and remove a knocked down pedestrian pole. At the point in time, it was unclear what caused the damage.

Tuesday, May 27, 2025 @ 3:45PM: Report of signal completely out at intersection of N. Burhans Blvd. and Mitchell/Park Lane. Supervisor on call confirmed report and notified signal technician. It was determined that the neutral on the pole was causing the signal box to not have proper operation power. The HLD-On-Call technician was notified and responded to correct the issue. Signal technician stayed on site to ensure the signal was operating correctly after repairs.

Friday, May 30, 2025 @ 11:55PM: Dispatch reported a tree fallen on a parked car and blocking both lanes in front of 13 E. Washington St. HFD, HPD Auxiliary were already working on site. Street personnel was called in and the tree was removed from the car, the debris pushed to sidewalk, and cones and caution tapes placed around the area.

Saturday, May 31, 2025 @ 8:55AM: Supervisor on call was notified by dispatch that the gate arm at the University Parking Deck would not rise and vehicles could not exit. A technician reset the system to allow customers to leave the deck.

Saturday, May 31, 2025 @ 10:27AM: Dispatch reported a call for a limb blocking the alley and parking lot at 151 S. Potomac St. A large portion of a pear tree belonging to St. Marks Lutheran Church broke off falling into the alley. While the alley is blocked, the tree is not blocking any parking spaces or lot nor is it restricting access due to its specific location. A voice message was left for the church alerting them to the issue.

Saturday, May 31, 2025 @ 2:18 PM: PW was notified of same issue as earlier in the day at University Deck. The gate arm at A & E Deck would not rise and patrons could not exit the deck. Staff reset system.

Saturday, May 31, 2025 @ 3:41PM: Dispatch reported a tree down in area of E. Franklin St. at McDonald's and CVS entrance. Staff found a tree from private property had fallen and was blocking the turn lane and part of a lane on E. Franklin St. Staff directed traffic around the hazard. Public Works Street staff was called and they responded with backhoe and cut the tree, pushing the debris off the roadway and sidewalk.

Sunday, June 1, 2025 @ 6:48AM: Parking expected a busy day from events, and a technician was called in to preemptively reset the systems at UD and A&E decks given the previous day's issues. After that no issues were reported.

Sunday, June 1, 2025 @ 11:23PM: Dispatch reported debris in street in the area of Wesel and S. Burhans Blvd. after a vehicle accident. A street sweeper was dispatched to site in the morning to clean up glass and absorbent remaining from accident.


