**ENGINEERING & PERMITS**

1. **Fine Arts Museum Expansion** – staff met with museum staff and their design consultant to review their plans for expanding the museum and redeveloping the former Bock Oil property along Highland Avenue. The current state of the museum’s efforts will be reviewed at a City Council meeting in July.
2. **Carmax** – work on the new Carmax facility along Dual Highway is nearing completion, including the construction of Trolley Drive, a new public street that will eventually be extended to intersect with Emmert Road.
3. **Wheaton Park** – staff worked with our paving contractor to reconstruct portions of the walking trails in the park in advance of the planned Juneteenth activities on June 19<sup>th</sup>.

#### Incidents

6/7/25 – *Gasoline Spill* – W Antietam Street – passenger car leaking fuel from engine compartment onto the roadway. HFD crews contained the spill and prevented runoff from entering storm drain system.

6/9/25 – *Building Fire* – 1650 Pullman Lane – fire on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of hotel, quickly contained and extinguished. Cause of fire under investigation by the HFD Fire Marshals Office.

### Smoke Alarm Program

6/7/25 – HFD firefighters completed the bimonthly neighborhood smoke alarm program in the following areas: Outer Drive, Outer Circle, Cedarwood Drive, Bramly Drive, Carroll Heights Blvd., Crescent Road, Sunnyside Drive, and Wayne Avenue.

Firefighters knocked on 257 doors, contacted 110 residents, checked 30 smoke alarms for proper operation, and installed 24 new smoke alarms. This is a free program for all City residents.

### **MEDIA RELEASE:**

**Officer Update:** The police officer in yesterday’s shooting incident is identified as K9 Officer Langley Dean, a 19-year veteran of the police department.

After the arrest of Daniel Anderson for the shooting of Officer Dean, HPD Detectives and members of the Western Maryland Regional Crime Lab processed the scene. During the course of the search, a shotgun was recovered. It was determined that Anderson used a 20-gauge shotgun and fired on Officer Dean at close range.

Officer Dean has a significant injury to his arm and was also struck in the shoulder, face, and head. He will need additional surgeries to repair the wounds and remains at Meritus Medical Center.

Daniel Anderson has been held without bond and is detained at the Washington County Detention Center.

**Arrest:** On 6/12/25 at about 4:35pm the Crisis Negotiation Team successfully negotiated the suspect out of his house. The suspect is identified as Daniel Matthew Anderson, age 40 of Hagerstown. Officers initially responded to the house at approximately 5:00am for a report of a domestic violence assault. Anderson's wife allowed officers into the house and she had clear signs of being assaulted. There were also two children in the home at the time who were physically unharmed. An ambulance was called to the scene and the mother and children were placed in the ambulance.

As the mother was being attended to in the ambulance, officers were inside attempting to communicate with Anderson who was in a room with the door closed and locked. Due to the domestic assault, Anderson was going to be placed under arrest but refused to come out from behind the locked door. Officers continued to speak with him through the door and he continued to refuse to exit. One of the officers announced that he would be forcing the door open. Having probable cause to do so, the officer made entry into the room. As he did, Anderson fired a round from a shotgun striking the officer in the arm and penetrating his bicep. The officer immediately starting bleeding profusely and both officers exited the residence.

They went immediately to the ambulance that was still waiting outside. The paramedics quickly tended to the wound and were enroute to the hospital within about 60 seconds. The mother in this incident was treated and released from Meritus. The officer involved underwent surgery and is currently recovering at the hospital.

Numerous police resources were deployed to the scene and a command center was established. The Crisis Negotiation Team actively communicated with Anderson for eight hours. At approximately 4:35pm Anderson walked out of his house and was placed into custody, unharmed.

Anderson will be transported to the Washington County Detention Center and charged appropriately. A booking photo will be provided when it becomes available.

HPD wants to thank our community for their outpouring of support. In addition, we thank the Washington County Sheriff's Office, Maryland State Police and Frederick City Police Department. We were also supported by the Hagerstown Fire Department, Department of Emergency Services, Auxiliary Police and Community Rescue Service.

At the request of the injured officer, we will not be releasing his name at this time. He is a 19-year veteran of the Hagerstown Police Department. We are grateful for his service and thankful that he wasn't more seriously injured.

**Incident 6/12/25:** At 5:00 am on 6/12/25 officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the 700 block of Forrest Dr for a domestic violence related call. During the course of the call, the male suspect fired a round at one of our officers, striking him once in the arm. The officer is currently undergoing surgery and his injuries are considered non life threatening.


The suspect is still currently barricaded inside the home. We have all available resources dedicated to the current situation. There are no other people inside the residence. We will update as we are able.




## A & E PARKING GARAGE OCCUPANCY
