## ENGINEERING & PERMITS

1. **Pavement Preservation** – the City’s contractor will return next week to complete overlaying the streets on the FY 25 pavement preservation list. Crack filling and patching operations have been ongoing for the past three weeks.
2. **MKS Business Park Stormwater Retrofit** – the contractor is constructing the concrete weir wall that will form the main outlet structure for the stormwater pond. Once complete, this project will allow the City to claim approximately 20 acres of credit against our MS4 stormwater permit.
3. **Intersection Improvements** – the new traffic signal poles have been installed at the intersection of Summit Avenue and Antietam Street, and the contractor will work to install the remaining equipment to put the new signal into operation. The contractor has also completed preliminary work for the new signal at the intersection of Salem Avenue and West Side Avenue.

**MEDIA RELEASE:** On Sunday, July 27, 2025 at about 2:30 am, Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the 200 block of W. Franklin for a report of shots fired. Within minutes, officers were able to identify the suspect from city surveillance cameras, locate him and place him under arrest. He was located in the 200 block of W. Franklin St outside his residence and is identified as Charles Anthony Rodgers, age 38 of Hagerstown. A search and seizure warrant was executed on the suspect's apartment. Detectives and officers recovered a .45 caliber Smith and Wesson handgun with ammunition. The handgun's serial number was obliterated.

Investigation revealed that there had been a verbal confrontation between the suspect and another male prior to the shooting. Rodgers aimed the gun at the victim and fired multiple rounds. Thankfully the victim was not struck.

Rodgers is currently detained at the Washington County Detention Center and is charged with the following:

- Attempted 2<sup>nd</sup> degree murder
- 1<sup>st</sup> / 2<sup>nd</sup> degree assault
- Reckless Endangerment
- Handgun on Person
- Firearm use in a Felony Violent Crime
- Knowingly Alter a Firearm ID Number






## A & E PARKING GARAGE OCCUPANCY


