ENGINEERING & PERMITS

1. **Carmax & Trolley Drive** – staff met with the developers and engineers for the Reese Farm development along Emmert Road to discuss the construction of Trolley Drive, the new public roadway next to Carmax on Dual Highway. Trolley Drive will provide a connection to Dual Highway that will allow drivers to avoid the Dual Highway/Day Road intersection.
2. **Pavement Preservation** – Craig Paving plans to return during the week of August 11th to complete the FY 25 pavement preservation street list. One of the major streets that will be milled and overlaid is S. Potomac Street between Memorial Blvd. and Howard Street.
3. **Upcoming Bid Openings** – next week, staff will open bids for three projects: Hager House Visitor Center, Wheaton Park Stage, and Weller’s Alley Decorative Fence.

August 5 – Public Education – National Night Out at Fairgrounds Park – Companies provided displays of fire equipment and offered fire safety education materials to attendees.

Bimonthly Smoke Alarm Neighborhood Canvass

August 2 – All companies participated in bimonthly neighborhood smoke alarm canvassing. The following streets were targeted: Avon Road, Oxford Circle, Bryan Place 200 & 300 blocks, West Side Avenue 200 & 300 blocks, Alexander Street 200 & 300 blocks, Salem Avenue 800,900 & 1000 blocks, West Church Street 800,900 & 1000 blocks.

312 homes were visited. Firefighters contacted 96 residents, installing 17 new smoke alarms.

Significant Events

July 30 – 300 North Potomac Street – Building Fire – Crews responded to a reported building fire. On arrival, found a small kitchen fire in an unoccupied 4th floor apartment. Fire extinguished and unit ventilated. No damage to other units and no people were displaced.

July 31 – 11 South Walnut Street – Cooking Fire - Crews responded to a reported building fire. On arrival, a small kitchen fire due to cooking was found. Fire extinguished and apartment ventilated. No damage to other units or displaced people.

August 3 – 146 West Bethel Street - Building Fire – Crews responded to a reported building fire. On arrival, firefighters found a small fire along a windowsill with some extension into the wall. Fire was extinguished. Cause of fire was discarded smoking materials. The property was turned over to residents.

August 3 – 109 Manor Drive Apt. 201 – Cooking Fire - Crews responded to a reported building fire. On arrival, responding personnel found a small kitchen fire due to cooking. Fire extinguished and apartment ventilated. No damage to other units or displaced people.

August 4 – 1380 Marshal Street – Building Fire - Crews responded to a reported building fire. Arriving units found a small fire burning in the ceiling. Fire was extinguished and area overhauled. Cause of fire was electrical wiring in a unit that was under renovation.

August 5 – 664 Hayes Avenue – Natural Gas Leak/Rupture – Companies responded for a natural gas line leak that was caused by a contractor digging in the area. Columbia Gas arrived and secured the leak. Fire Department personnel ensured no hazards remained from the gas. Unit cleared the scene and there were no injuries or displaced people.

Neighborhood Vitality	Conditions which cause or tend to cause diminution to property
	<u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants.
	<u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens
Preventive Maintenance	Conditions which are technical violations and need addressed to prevent deterioration.
	<u>Example:</u> Mortar deterioration, clogged gutters, minor rotting wood
Planning & Zoning	Conditions which violate Land Management Code requirements (zoning, forest conservation, floodplain, historic district and other requirements) and progress inspections of development projects for site plan compliance.
	<u>Examples:</u> Uses not permitted in property's zone, construction of new facilities, follow up inspections on open violations.






A & E PARKING GARAGE OCCUPANCY

AFTER HOURS CALL BACKS

Tuesday, July 29, 2025 @ 3:15PM: An accident was reported at the southwest corner of W. Franklin St. and Winter St. with possible damage to signal equipment. Staff inspected ped pole and found minimal damage with minor paint scraped due to impact.
