ENGINEERING & PERMITS

1. **32 North Potomac Street** – the contractor was finally able to get a passing State inspection of the new elevator, which moves the City closer to being able to occupy the second floor of the building. The contractor is calling for final inspections to close all outstanding permits.

2. **Consolidated Transportation Program** – staff participated in a virtual meeting with the MD Department of Transportation and the State Highway Administration in preparation for the annual tour meeting scheduled for October 9th.

3. **Railroad Crossings** – staff met with a representative of CSX Transportation to look at the failing crossings on Soth Potomac Street and Walnut Street. CSX is willing to make temporary repairs to these crossings until they can be permanently replaced. City staff will work to schedule these repairs with CSX and our paving contractor.

Significant Events

September 5 – 339 Linganore Avenue. – Natural Gas Leak – Crews were called by Columbia Gas to assist with an underground gas leak. The 300 block of Linganore Avenue was evacuated for a short period while Columbia Gas secured the leak. There were no injuries.

September 9 – 15 Randolph Avenue – Cooking Fire – Crews responded for a reported fire. The fire was out upon the fire department’s arrival. There were no reported injuries. Ventilation was provided; the property was then turned over to the occupant.

Community Events

September 6 – Neighborhood Smoke Alarm Survey – On duty crews canvassed the Jefferson Boulevard neighborhoods area by visiting individual households. Crews knocked on 257 doors, contacted 89 occupants, and installed or repaired 17 smoke alarms.

September 6 – Conservit Family Picnic – Truck 3 attended the Conservit Family Picnic and provide public education materials and equipment displays for the attendees.

September 9 – Remembrance in the Park – Shift Commander, Engine 2, Truck 4, and Special Unit 3-2 attended the ceremony in City Park to remember and recognize the events and people lost on 9/11/2001.

At its September 10 meeting, the Planning Commission took action on the following items:

Site Plan approvals:

- Dollar General store on the east side of Burhans Boulevard, north of Church Street
- City boat ramp to Antietam Creek on the north side of Mt. Aetna Road
- Parking lot improvement for mixed use building on Potomac Avenue at Maple St.
- Church addition for Hagerstown Church on Washington Square (High Street)
- Parking lot improvements for the "Burnap Lot" in City Park
- 240-unit apartment complex on the Reese Farm property (Emmert Road)

Subdivision Plat approvals:

- Consolidation plat for the Antietam Paper building on West Antietam Street
- Consolidation plat for the Transit Authority property on Devonshire Road

Rezoning Recommendations:

- Lorich tract on Dual Highway – recommended approval.
- Hospital tracts downtown – recommended not to move forward on rezoning and having the issue studied and addressed in the upcoming comprehensive plan and comprehensive rezoning. Or possibly create a unique Planned Unit Development (PUD) standard in the Zoning Ordinance that could be used for redeveloping the sites with community input and more directed planning.






A & E PARKING GARAGE OCCUPANCY
