# ENGINEERING & PERMITS

1. **Antietam Creek Access Park (Phase I):** A Pre-bid meeting was held on-site Wednesday with several contractors in attendance, along with representatives from Frederick Seibert & Assoc. The project includes the construction of a small parking area and an access point for individuals to launch small watercraft on the Antietam Creek.
  
2. **Burnap Parking Lot:** The contractor has completed the installation of all the perimeter soil erosion and sediment control measures and is proceeding with the installation of concrete curbs.
  
3. **Salem @ West Side Intersection Improvements:** The contractor has completed all required work, and the project has now entered the 1-year warranty period.



## Significant Events

September 28 – 129 East Lee Street – Building Fire - Units arrived to find smoke showing from a 2-story residence. Fire was burning in the rear wall extending from the 1<sup>st</sup> floor into the attic space. Fire was extinguished and held to building of origin. The cause was improperly discarded smoking materials. There were no injuries.

September 30 – 105 Bryan Place – Building Fire – Crews arrived to find a kitchen fire that was extinguished prior to arrival. Two occupants self-transported to Meritus Er for burn injuries and smoke inhalation. HFD personnel ensured fire was out, ventilated, and installed 2 smoke detectors.



## Community Events

September 27 – Color Splash at Fairgrounds Park – HFD crews were on-site to assist with the event and provide a wash-down afterwards.



September 29 – Crews conducted after the fire survey/smoke alarm survey in the neighborhoods around the Lee Street location of the building fire on September 28. Firefighters knocked on 117 doors, connecting with 35 residents. Crews installed 5 smoke alarms, 3 of which were replacements for existing smoke alarms that no longer functioned.

## Other News

September 29 – New Engine 1 was inspected at the 4-Guys factory in Meyersdale, PA and made the return trip home the same date. The unit will be placed in service in the next several weeks.

## PLANNING & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Planning Commission hosted one of its busiest meetings in many years on September 10. Topics included:

1. Approved a consolidation plat combining multiple lots of record into a single lot for the Antietam Paper site.
2. Approved a consolidation lot combining multiple lots and quitclaimed alley right of way for the Washington County Transit Authority.
3. Declined to provide a positive recommendation for the requested rezoning of three tracts of land formerly part of the Washington County Hospital site on East Antietam and East Baltimore Streets. The applicant has since withdrawn the application.
4. Recommended approval of the rezoning of approximately 22 acres of the Lorich tract on Dual Highway. Public Hearing with the Mayor and City Council is slated for October.
5. Approved a site plan for the reconfiguration and improvement of the parking area on the Wells House planned facility on Potomac Avenue at Maple Avenue.
6. Approved a site plan for an addition to Hagerstown Church on Washington Square.
7. Approved a site plan for the completion of the Burnap Parking lot in City Park.
8. Approved a site plan for the apartment complex at Reese Farm (Hebb Road)
9. Approved a site plan for a Dollar General Store on the east side of Burhans Boulevard north of Church Street (former Manbeck Bread site)
10. Approved a site plan for a City boat ramp on Antietam Creek on Mt. Aetna Road.

The Commission also met on September 24 with a shorter but just as important and detailed agenda. Topics included:

1. Approval of a sketch plan for a mixed use development that would include approximately 750 homes of varying types (singles, apartments, three different types of townhouses) and two commercial lots on the 93-acre "Lorich Tract" (Harrison Property) on the east side of Dual Highway. Given the size and density of the development and the interest the pending rezoning of a portion of the site drew, staff took the effort to notify the surrounding community of the sketch plan review. Several persons attended the hearing and expressed concerns with several elements of the plan. The project now moves to the development plan phase.
2. Approval of a minor site plan for a local conversion overlay district (store) at 401 Center Street.
3. Consultation with a potential developer of the Snook Tract between MD 144 and US 40, north of McCleary Hill. This is a neck of the City wedged between two previously developed residential areas in the county (Cedar Lawn). The developer desires to subdivide and develop this property for about 30 lots in a manner consistent with the development on each side of it (open section streets without sidewalks). After discussion, the Planning Commission was open to entertaining waivers to these requirements.

The business is an excellent addition to Hagerstown's Main Street District.






