# ENGINEERING & PERMITS

1. **Electronics Recycling** – the annual electronics recycling event was held on November 1<sup>st</sup> at Fairgrounds Park. Approximately 140 residents dropped off old electronic equipment and paper to be shredded. This event is well-received by the public, and we plan on continuing it indefinitely.
2. **City Hall Roof Replacement** – the contractor plans to start work during the week of November 10<sup>th</sup> to replace the five flat roof areas on City Hall. Materials were lifted onto the roof on November 1<sup>st</sup> in advance of the work starting.
3. **Burnap Parking Lot** – work continues on reshaping and regrading the existing gravel parking lot near the City Park tennis courts, in preparation for paving and striping the lot. The contractor is hoping to complete the project before the asphalt plants shut down for the winter.
4. **Intersection Improvements** – the ARPA project to replace the traffic signals at the Antietam St/Summit Avenue and Salem Avenue/West Side Avenue intersections is complete.

## Community Events

October 31 – Citywide Trick-or-Treat – Multiple HFD units participated in giving out candy and providing equipment displays in city neighborhoods in support of Trick-or-Treat activities

November 1 – Monthly Smoke Alarm Neighborhood Canvas – Firefighters visited multiple streets in the West End as part of the monthly Smoke Alarm Neighborhood Campaign. Crews were able to contact 63 residents of the 241 homes that were visited. 11 new smoke alarms were installed while 9 homes had alarms repaired or replaced.

November 3 – Operation Warm at Salem Avenue Elementary School – HFD personnel and members of L-1605 distributed approximately 155 winter coats to students in need. Students also had the opportunity to see fire trucks and learn about the equipment.

## PLANNING & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

### Planning & Economic Development

Due to the pending holidays, the Planning Commission and the Historic District Commission revert to meeting once per month in November and December. Both bodies schedule two meetings per month January to October.

The October 29 meeting of the Planning Commission was cancelled for lack of an agenda. The Commission meets on November 12 with a light agenda.

**New Development Proposals:** A sketch plan for 30 duplex dwellings has been received for a parcel on the east side of Eastern Boulevard, south of Old Forge Road and north of Klick Way. The houses will front Eastern Boulevard and have rear yard parking access. A sketch plan for the recently annexed “Heavens Heights” property at the traffic circle on Southern Boulevard was received recently. The plans call for 30 semi-detached dwelling units and one single-family dwelling. Ten of the semi-detached homes will front Southern Boulevard. Both of these developments are applying the new subdivision standards adopted in the recent past to promote seamless residential development over isolated pods of homes surrounded by forest and landscaping buffers and berms, and reduced street widths. Thirteen of the homes in the Heavens Heights plan front into community open space.

The Board of Zoning Appeals has an unusually large docket of 6 cases scheduled for their meeting on November 12.

## Department Representation at Events

On October 23, The Planning & Economic Development Department welcomed The Maryland Appropriation Committee to Hagerstown. The visit included a tour of Meritus Park, and downtown Hagerstown.

Also on October 23, staff attended the Economic Summit where Economist Dr. Anirban Basu shared his insights on the state of the economy. Dr. Basu dived into global, national, and local economics during his engaging discussion.

Economic Development staff visited 5 selected businesses in honor of business appreciation week. We want to take the moment to recognize and sincerely thank all the businesses for their dedication and continued support to make a meaningful impact on the community.

## Grand Openings & Anniversary Celebrations

On November 4<sup>th</sup> we proudly celebrate The University System of Maryland at Hagerstown 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. USMH, located at 32 West Washington Street, opened its doors in 2005 to provide regional access to higher education for the surrounding area, and has since expanded to four (4) buildings located in the heart of Downtown Hagerstown.






**A & E PARKING GARAGE OCCUPANCY**
