1. **New Businesses:**

2. **New Development Cases:**

3. **Planning Commission:** On September 25, the Planning Commission reviewed and approved a concept plan for storm water management at 400 West Memorial Boulevard for GTS Welco.

4. **Update of Long-Range Transportation Plan:** Staff participated in a webinar on the update of the Hagerstown Eastern Panhandle Metropolitan Planning Organization's Long-Range Transportation Plan. The consultants have been reviewing public input results, existing planning documents, and 2010 Census statistics. The next step will be to meet with local planners and engineers to start refining transportation priorities for the region. The next MPO meeting will be on October 16th at Hagerstown Regional Airport. The plan update is anticipated to be completed by March or April 2014. The progress of this project can be monitored at www.hepmpo.com.

5. **RFP for Downtown Economic Analysis and Implementation Plan Project:** The RFP was posted to various professional service web sites on September 25th. It will also be advertised in the *Herald-Mail* in the coming days. The deadline for submitting questions on the RFP is October 9th (when an addendum will be created) and the deadline for submittal of RFP responses is October 30th. We anticipate award of a contract for this project on November 26th and a project start date of December 2nd.

PARKS & ENGINEERING

1. **MDOT Pre-Tour Meeting** Staff attended the "pre-Tour" meeting with MDOT staff this week. The Secretary's Tour date in Washington County is Thursday, October 3rd at 10 a.m. We note four "gas tax" (Investment Act of 2013) projects in Hagerstown that will be announced at the Tour meeting:
 - 181 bridge over the Potomac River (\$47 million)
 - Frederick Street sidewalks (\$400,000)
 - Pave Route 40 through Hagerstown next Spring
 - Pave South Potomac Street from Downsville Road south next Spring.
2. **Golf Course** – staff is planning a golf tournament called Par Fore Pink on Friday, October 18 with a shotgun start at 1pm (flyer attached).
3. **Annual Overlay** The contractor has completed the slurry and patches and is starting on the HMA re-surface and milling. By the end of next week we expect most, if not all of the overlay to be completed.
4. **Street Tree Planting** We opened bids for the Street Tree Planting as funded through Chesapeake Bay Trust Grant. Five bidders had purchased bid documents but only one submitted an actual bid. The contract amount will be less than \$25,000.
5. **Multi-Use Path at Park Circle** The Multi-Use Path is complete except for the pavement markings, and we have submitted a request for reimbursement from State of Maryland for the remainder of the \$75,000 grant.
6. **University District Parking Deck Repairs** The repairs to the University District Parking Deck are scheduled to begin October 7th.
7. **Ghost Tours** Staff is planning for the City Park Ghost Tours to be held October 18th, 19th, 25th and 26th with tour times at 7pm, 8pm, and 9pm. (flyer attached)
8. Daily maintenance continues throughout parks including tree work, landscaping, building maintenance repairing and painting.
9. Beginning to winterize some of our facilities: pool, stadium, little leagues etc.
10. Arts in the Park 2013 season finale held at City Park Band Shell on Wednesday, Sept 25th: Open Mic Night.
