**Categories of Conditions**

Safety	Conditions which are or reasonably present a hazard to occupant or public. <u>Example:</u> No smoke alarms, improper wiring, handrails
Neighborhood Vitality	Conditions which cause or tend to cause diminution to property <u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants. <u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens
Preventive Maintenance	Conditions which are technical violations and need addressed to prevent deterioration. <u>Example:</u> Mortar deterioration, clogged gutters, minor rotting wood
Planning & Zoning	Conditions which violate Land Management Code requirements (zoning, forest conservation, floodplain, historic district and other requirements) and progress inspections of development projects for site plan compliance. <u>Examples:</u> Uses not permitted in property's zone, construction of new facilities, follow up inspections on open violations.

**PARKS & ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT**

1. **Coastal Bays Grant** Thanks to the work of Jim Bender and the support of others, we have been notified that the City was successful in securing a \$500,000 grant to design and construct two stormwater retrofit facilities in the Antietam Creek watershed. One is on Frederick Street near the sewer plant and one is near our Central Maintenance Garage. We are still awaiting details on the grant award.
2. **Frederick Street sidewalks** As requested by the City several years ago, the State Highway Administration will be installing new sidewalks on both sides of Frederick Street (Alt 40) from Willow Circle down to Kenly Avenue (around the City limits). They plan to start in the next couple weeks. Work will take about three months.

3. **Recreation Calendar** As we continue to develop a viable recreation program for the City, we have planned many interesting and diverse events and programs for the upcoming year. Attached is the calendar as it currently stands.
4. **Community Parks & Playgrounds FY14** To be 100% funded by CP&P (\$26,000), six merry-go-rounds have been ordered and received, to replace antiquated ones in our parks. We have already installed the bases at Hellane Park; we are now working on Staley Park and Pangborn Park.
5. **Prep for Park Season** We are cleaning up our parks to prepare for our park season which begins March 28<sup>th</sup>. The restrooms will be opened for the park season.

1. **Problem Areas.** Recent call-outs included:

3. **Engineering** Staff worked on the following projects:

- Engineering staff completed multiple permit reviews and service upgrade requests.
- The Staff Engineer presented clarifications regarding the HLD Safety Manual to line crews after the review and presentation of the new HLD Safety Manual.
- Engineering staff attended the annual Maryland Pesticide and Safety Conference to receive training and annual certification for the application of Herbicide to HLD rights-of-way to prevent vegetation ingress to HLD high voltage electric facilities.
- The Staff Engineer mapped HLD's high voltage switchgear in the Electric GIS model. These devices allow HLD to distribute and protect industrial loads attached to HLD's system. Properly mapping these devices in HLD's electric model with correct connectivity allows us to simulate outages and restoration plans as well as maintain records of the installations.

4. **Administration:**

- Staff repaired damaged aluminum street light poles that can now be returned to the system. Often damaged by snow plows, cars, etc., these poles are brought into the shop for scrap or repair. HLD can mitigate costs by fabricating new pieces and welding the damage on most poles at a great savings to the City.

Laboratory


- The testing of proficiency samples for the lab's annual recertification was completed and the results submitted to the provider.
