2. REPORTS

- **03/27/14:** Officer Johnson was dispatched to the Washington County Free Library for a report of theft. The victim advised he walked away from the table he was sitting at for a moment and when he returned his personal belongings were gone. The suspect was captured on video. No further information is available at this time.
- **03/28/14:** Officer Lucas responded to Cleveland Avenue for a report of a burglary. The victim stated an unknown suspect had entered the vacant residence and removed most of the copper piping and wiring from the basement. It should be noted that the circumstances and nature of this burglary are similar to other incidents which are currently under investigation. No further information is available at this time.

3. PRESS RELEASES

- On March 29 officers were dispatched to Concord Street in reference to shots fired. The officers were unable to locate suspects or victims. Officers located three parked motor vehicles and a house that sustained damage (bullet holes) from the gunfire. - On March 31 officers from the Hagerstown Police Department were dispatched to the area of Dual Highway for a subject en-route to Meritus Medical Center with a 15-year old male that had a gunshot wound to the head. Responding officers later learned the juvenile sustained a self-inflicted gunshot wound to the head while inside his home. The juvenile later succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead. No foul play was suspected.

4. OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION

- A team of assessors from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc (CALEA) will arrive on April 6, 2014 to examine and evaluate all aspects of the Hagerstown Police Department's policy and procedures, management, operations, and support services. Verification by the team that the Hagerstown Police Department meets the Commission's state-of-the-art standards is part of a voluntary process to gain accreditation, a highly-prized recognition of public safety professional excellence.

Once the CALEA Assessors complete their review of the agency, they report back to the full Commission, which will then decide if the agency is to be granted accredited status. Accreditation is for three years, during which the agency must submit annual reports attesting continued compliance with those standards under which it was accredited.
- Welcome to Officer Angela Mallick, Hagerstown's newest police officer. She graduated from the Allegheny County Police Training Academy in December 2013 and just completed her firearm's training last week. She was sworn in on Tuesday, April 1, 2014, at City Hall. Officer Mallick has been assigned the Uniform Patrol Division's Baker Platoon.

- Effective Monday, April 14, Officers Lippy and Brashears will be transferred to the Downtown Squad. Officer Lippy joined the Hagerstown Police Department in January of 2012 and Officer Brashears came in March of 2012. Both will be under the command of Sgt. Eric Knode. We wish them well with their new beat.

¹After-hours call out data includes contact with Public Works typically by Washington County Emergency Management. The issues can vary from debris in the street (tree or tree limbs, glass, etc.), traffic signal operations (signal goes into flash operation), traffic signs (call outs are usually only for STOP or YIELD signs), parking system issues (gates at either deck malfunction, equipment malfunctions, etc) to fleet maintenance issues. The call outs reported here involve a supervisor being contacted about an issue after normal working hours. Field personnel may or may not be contacted depending upon the issue. Snow operations with full staff are not included.

STREET SWEEPING: Sweeping operations resumes on a regular schedule beginning on March 31st. Warning tickets will be issued first in the downtown to give property owners notice that sweeping has resumed. Parking tickets will be issued beginning on April 7th.
