BUSINESS & COMMUNITY RELATIONS DIVISION

1. **Neighborhoods 1st Updates**

- Historic Heights Porchfest event planning is underway. Porchfest is scheduled for Saturday, September 13th from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. The event highlights the Historic South Prospect Street area by closing the street for the afternoon and inviting musicians to use porches along the street as stages.
- The Neighborhoods 1st Leadership Team Meeting was held July 7th. Chief Holtzman discussed neighborhood policing and crime concerns. Group leaders were made aware of the new Report-A-Concern feature on the Police Department's web page.
- Preliminary steps have been taken for the formation of a new Neighborhoods 1st group in the South End. The first meeting for this potential group is scheduled for early August.

2. **Events**

- The Hagerstown Municipal Band held a picnic celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Band's founding on Saturday, July 12 at City Park. On Sunday, July 13, the Hagerstown Municipal Band held a concert officially celebrating the 100th Anniversary Season. It was held at North High because of the inclement weather.
 - Four consecutive Saturday summer evenings of family, friends and free music began on Saturday, July 12th with the *Music by the Lake* concert series. All of the *free* concerts are held from 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM at the City Park Bandshell. Last Saturday, 270 patrons heard music from Dark Hollow Bluegrass Band of Madison. The series will continue on Saturday, July 19th with the Annapolis Bluegrass Coalition. Back by popular demand, the Annapolis Bluegrass Coalition is the premier bluegrass band in the Annapolis, Maryland area. A love of bluegrass is deeply ingrained in the souls of these five fine musicians, and they have been winning the hearts of bluegrass fans from all around the Chesapeake Bay. The City of Hagerstown, the Washington County Arts Council, and the Hagerstown-Washington County Convention and Visitors Bureau are proud sponsors of the *Music by the Lake* concert series. Attendees are encouraged to bring your lawn chairs or blankets. In the event of rain, the concerts will be cancelled. Please no smoking.
 - Motorcycles will line the streets of Downtown Hagerstown for the fourth annual City Center Bike Night on Friday, July 18 from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM. Visitors can come and experience four blocks filled with all types of motorcycles in conjunction with great live music by Prophets of the Abstract Truth. Prophets of the Abstract Truth combine sax, guitar, vocals, hand percussion and a variety of basses in a way that has never before been experienced. The band creates a mystical blend of blues, bossa nova and Latin-tinged modern jazz standards, as well as jazzy covers of Grateful Dead, Allman Brothers and even The Beatles. In addition there will fun activities for the kids, all sorts of vendors and food and beverages available from local restaurants, The Maryland Theatre and the Alsatia Club. The Maryland Theatre will be selling wine/beer cups for \$5. The new Wind Down format is incorporated into the event. The event is sponsored by The Maryland Theatre and The City of Hagerstown.
 - Krump's Donut Alley Rally 5k Run/Walk will be held at 7:30 PM on Friday, August 8, 2014. All proceeds will benefit The Wounded Warrior Project.
 - Market Faire On-The-Square will be held on August 14 from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Vendors will offer fresh local produce, fruits, flowers and much more!
 - The next Wind Down will be held on August 22, 2014. The Maryland Theatre and their committee has selected a sports theme for the event and it is entitled "Game On." It's a night of fun and games as we celebrate many of America's favorite pastimes. "Lucky Punk" is the band playing on South Potomac Street in the Arts & Entertainment District. After all, dancing is a sport, right? There's a play area for the kids and plenty of activities for grown-ups, too!
 - Augustoberfest will be held on August 23 and 24, 2014. On Saturday the event will be slated for 11:00 AM to 10:00 PM and on Sunday from 11:00 AM to 5:00 PM. This Hagerstown tradition, now in its 9th year, features Bavarian entertainment and food.
 - Staff is working with groups on three September events including Porchfest, September 13; City Park Fall Fest, September 20 and Thunder In The Square, September 25.

Safety	Conditions which are or reasonably present a hazard to occupant or public. <u>Example:</u> No smoke alarms, improper wiring, handrails
Neighborhood Vitality	Conditions which cause or tend to cause diminution to property <u>Example:</u> Weeds, trash, debris, junk vehicles, deterioration of a structure.
Quality of Life	Conditions which negatively impact occupants. <u>Example:</u> Damaged surfaces, damages elements, missing screens

PARKS & ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT

1. **Rt 40 Overlay.** Yet another change of plans by State Highway, the week of August 4th they will mill and pave Washington Avenue and Franklin Streets, from Nottingham Road to Walnut Street. The work will be done before school starts. Work will be completed during the daytime hours of 7AM-5PM. The rest of the City from Cannon Avenue to Walnut Street and the Dual Highway will reportedly be done in 2015.
2. **43-53 West Washington Street.** Now that the asbestos has been removed from 43 West Washington Street, the General Contractor is back on the job and should be demolishing the old two-story brick portion next week. Then he will begin reconstruction of the remaining rear wall.
3. **City Park New Pavilion.** Approved for POS funding, to be installed on the west bank of the lake in City Park, we started excavating and hauling in stone for the footers and floor. The prefabricated gazebo should be received next week.
4. **Potterfield Pool Maintenance.** On Thursday, as planned, shut down of the main and wading pools was done to replace the propeller on the large pump motor, replace some loose ceramic tile, repair the white coat. All the work was completed and the pool will be open Friday.
5. **Christmas in July.** In preparation for this Saturday's "Christmas in July" at the Hagerstown Railroad Museum at City Park, we picked up Thomas the Train and obtained the required State inspection. Other preparations include setting up tents, hauling in tables and benches, etc. The Polar Express movie will be shown (see attached flyer).
6. **Bike Lanes.** We have revised the drawings for the six streets where bike lanes are proposed and returned them to the State for final review. These lanes are funded with a \$70,000 grant.
7. **Oh Ranger!** There is a new App for smart phones called *Oh Ranger! ParkFinder* which searches for parks in your area. We noticed none of the City parks were listed so we completed a database of information and sent it to the software developer to include in the App.

The suspect was placed under arrest, transported to Central Booking and charged with Assault 1st and 2nd degree, Reckless Endangerment and Disorderly Conduct.
- **07/14/14:** Officer Weedon was dispatched to Dick's Sporting Goods for a report of counterfeit currency being used for a purchase. After the money exchange, the clerk realized the \$100 bill was counterfeit. The employee was able to observe the suspect get into his Chevrolet Traverse with his NJ tags. The case is being investigated by the Secret Service.

As a police officer, Aleshire tries to keep peace in her four schools while working with the students who are learning to cope with the scary outside world. She wants to prove to young people that the police are not the enemy.


