PARKS & ENGINEERING

2. PRESS RELEASES

- **10/02/14:** Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to the first block of Murph Avenue for a report of a shooting incident. Officers located evidence to confirm that a shooting took place, but the person(s) involved had fled the area prior to the officers arriving on scene. Within hours of the shooting, investigators learned that a black Mercedes was involved and the owner was interviewed. The identity of a second subject was also learned. Both suspects are on parole and were wearing GPS ankle bracelets which placed them at the crime scene at the time of the shooting. Both were arrested and charged with this crime.

- **10/04/14:** Officers from the Hagerstown Police Department responded to Sheetz on North Potomac Street to make contact with a male reporting he was the victim of an armed robbery. The victim stated he was at 441 North Potomac Street when a male with a handgun demanded his money and personal property. The victim complied with the suspect's demands and gave an undisclosed amount of money and his cell phone. The victim was not injured during the incident. During the course of the investigation, detectives developed Juan Antonio Adams Jr as the suspect. The victim positively identified Adams as the one who robbed him. Adams was taken into custody without incident and was found to be in possession of the victim's cell phone. Adams was charged with armed robbery and other related charges.
- **10/06/14:** Officers of the Hagerstown Police Department responded to Little Caesar's Pizza on Burhans Boulevard for a reported strong arm robbery. Officers located the victim and learned he was assaulted by the suspect in the front parking lot of the business and the suspect fled with an undisclosed amount of cash. Officer Kelley is attuned to the routine activities of the downtown area and often takes a proactive approach to resolving issues as they arise. Based on his initiative and devotion to the downtown area, Officer Kelley was selected as the Hagerstown Police Department Officer of the Month for September 2014. The Hagerstown Police Department is proud to have dedicated officers such as Officer Kelley as one of its own and congratulates him for a job well done.


