PLANNING & CODE ADMINISTRATION DIVISION

1. **Planning Commission:** The Planning Commission took the following action on September 9:
 - Centre at Hagerstown – Lot 6 – approved the ESD Concept Plan.
 - North Market Plaza – Northeast Corner of Salem Avenue and Broadfording Road – approved a site plan amendment for signage at the proposed A C & T.
 - Washington County Roads – 601 Northern Avenue – approved the site plan for fuel center upgrades.
 - Conducted a workshop for future landscaping waiver requests for an eight-foot security fence at 920 West Washington Street.
 - Indoor Plant Cultivation and Processing Facilities Text Amendment – recommended approval of the text amendment to the Mayor and City Council.

PARKS & ENGINEERING

1. **A & E Trail Update.** Based on our positive meeting with the Herald Mail ownership regarding the land acquisition, we are planning the following schedule:
 - Advertise for bids: October 16th
 - Bid opening: November 19th
 - Mayor and Council workshop: December 1st
 - Mayor and Council approval of contract: December 15th

We plan to have all land acquisition Ordinances for Mayor and Council review in October/November.

2. **Pavement Preservation.** The contractor has commenced work and is completing crack-sealing and slurry. In the next week or two, milling and overlay will start. By contract, all work must be done by October 9th.
3. **Pavement Markings.** Pavement markings have been repainted centerlines on several streets. Once we see the cost to-date, we will likely send them another list to repaint. They have also been re-applying thermoplastic crosswalk lines and stop bars at intersections all over the City, and have completed about half of the ones on our list.
4. **Alleys 3-36 and 5-11.** We held the preconstruction meeting with contractor. The expected start of construction date is September 28th. We will coordinate the work with adjacent property owners.
5. **Street Trees.** We inspected all of the approximately 500 trees planted this year by Aspen and found a number of trees that appear to be dead. We wanted to make a record of these trees before winter and will inspect them again in May 2016 just before the one-year warranty is over. At that time we will send contractor a list of trees that need to be replaced.
6. **Kiwanis Park.** Construction is complete on the second of two boardwalks as well as cleaning up around the new pavilion, grading and seeding. We have graded for the new walkways from the board walks to boat ramp and pavilion and prepared for blacktop. Also started working on grading new parking lot and curbing.

7. **Recreation News**

- Fall/Winter Recreation Events - Staff is preparing for a busy fall and winter season:
 - Attached is the Fall Fest flyer showcasing all the fun activities planned at City Park on September 19, including highlighted activities at the Hager House and Railroad Museums and the return of the Sailboats on the Lake!
 - Also, attached is our Fall Events promotional flyer showcasing all of the wonderful recreation events coming up this season!
- Golf Course - a new newsletter is being distributed via Constant Contact with the goal to continue this bi-weekly or once a month to promote upcoming specials and programs.
- Rec Programs:

2. **REPORTS**

- **09/05/15:** Officer Young responded to South Potomac Street for a report of a disturbance. The officer observed a female standing on the sidewalk yelling at individuals up the street. Officer Young advised the female to lower her voice due to the fact she was disturbing the neighborhood. The disorderly female had glassy eyes and smelled strongly of alcohol. The female advised she was upset because a friend she had been staying with had asked her to leave the residence. The upset female continued to be uncooperative and began hitting the friend and destroying property that belonged to other citizens. She was arrested and charged with Assault 2nd degree and other related charges.

- **09/07/15:** Officer Molineaux was dispatched to East Antietam Street for a reported vehicle theft. The victim stated someone had stolen his 2003 TOMOS moped overnight. The moped was chained to the fence in his backyard. It was entered into NCIC as stolen. There are no suspects at this time.
- **09/08/15:** Officer Bauknecht was dispatched to Concord Street for the report of a burglary. The victim stated that someone had pushed in her air conditioner to gain access to her residence. The suspect took a 12-pack of Bud Ice beer and some alcohol. There are no further details at this time.

3. PRESS RELEASES

- On 09/04/15 Hagerstown City Police Department took a strong stance against the persistent and visible crime of street level prostitution. Officers from HPD's Directive Patrol Unit, along with a female undercover officer, conducted a prostitution sting in the unit block of North Walnut Street. The purpose of the operation was to target "street level" prostitution activity. During this operation there were six suspects taken into custody. Each suspect will be charged with Solicitation for Prostitution.

This type of crime continues to be a high risk behavior for those involved and is tied closely with drug use and addiction. Once the suspects have been formally charged, and the Hagerstown Police Department plans to post the faces of the suspects involved in this activity along with the charges they each face. Hagerstown City Police Department will continue enforcement efforts to improve the safety and reputation of our community.

- On 09/07/15 at 6:56 p.m. officers from the Hagerstown Police Department responded to 526 George Street for a domestic in progress. The officers were advised that a female had stabbed a male and fled the area. Upon arrival the officers located a male with a single stab wound to his back. The male was transported to Meritus Medical Center with non-life threatening injuries. The female suspect, identified as Erica Lynn Feigley, had fled the scene in a vehicle prior to officer's arrival.

Officers located her a short time later in the 600 block of Adams Avenue. She was placed under arrest and transported to central booking. A knife was recovered at the scene and officers learned that Feigley and the victim are husband and wife. Erica Feigley is being charged with 1st Degree Assault, 2nd Degree Assault and Reckless Endangerment.

4. OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION

- HPD officers are currently receiving Narcan[®] training from the Washington County Health Department. Narcan[®] (naloxone) is a pharmaceutical medication which reverses life-threatening effects of heroin and other opioids by temporarily blocking opioid receptor sites within the brain. To date, two HPD officers have saved the lives of two overdose victims by applying Narcan.

Water Production at R C Willson

- The Phase IV work is nearing completion with final paving occurring this week. Distribution crews continue to work throughout the system flushing to pull the Chloraminated water through the water distribution system and tanks. SCADA work is ongoing.
- Operations
Operators primarily focused on new operations for the Chloramination system. Routine preventative maintenance work was also completed.
- Maintenance
Maintenance staff worked on routine preventive maintenance and continues to provide assistance with plant operations, as needed.
- Instrumentation
Instrumentation staff continues work with ABB on the new SCADA system. Staff also worked on the new conference room audio-visual improvements.

Water Production at Breichner

- The Edgemont Reservoir pool elevation is -6.6 feet below crest and the bypass valve and the hydrant are closed to allow for natural fluctuation of the pool elevation and seepage evaluation. Staff met with Triad Engineering on August 28th to discuss the findings from the on-going seepage evaluations – Triad is editing the report to include cost estimates and a prioritized sequence for future work.

- Crews responded to customer concerns throughout the service area. Crews also continued work on the water main project on Buford.






