## FIRE DEPARTMENT

1. **Fairview Road Fire.** The Hagerstown Fire Department responded to a house fire on Fairview Road. The fire was the result of unattended food on the stove. The residents of the home were alerted to the fire due to working smoke alarms allowing them to escape without injury.
2. **Hagerstown Fire Department Assistance**
  - Hagerstown firefighters with Engine 5, Engine 1, Truck 1 and Command Staff assisted Halfway Volunteer Fire Company with a two alarm fire on York Road early Thursday morning, October 22.
  - Engine 3, Engine 1, Truck 1 and Battalion Captain 33 responded to assist Funkstown with an apartment fire Wednesday, October 21.
  - Wednesday, October 21, Hagerstown Fire Department sent five rope rescue technicians to assist with the rescue of an individual at Maryland Heights Overlook.
3. **Fire Prevention Month.** Department staff continued their efforts in teaching fire prevention safety at several city elementary schools this week. October is Fire Prevention Month and the HFD would like to remind citizens to check their smoke alarm batteries on a monthly basis.

## PARKS & ENGINEERING

1. **Park Circle Roundabout.** The Park Circle Roundabout and Memorial Boulevard bio-retention project is complete except for a few items on the punch list. Alpha Space has completed the pavement markings and the stamped and colorized surface has been complete. We will leave the VMS boards up for a few weeks until local drivers get used to the new traffic pattern. We will be adding some 24-inch high delineators to extend the Walnut Street islands closer to the inner circle just to make sure no one tries to enter City Park at the wrong location.
2. **40-50 East Baltimore Street.** Demolition of 40-50 East Baltimore Street started this week. The asbestos has been removed and the red brick building is about half gone. This demolition should only take about 2-3 weeks to complete.
3. **Golf Course.** The 3<sup>rd</sup> annual **Par Fore Pink Tournament** will be held tomorrow, October 23<sup>rd</sup>, and we anticipate a full tournament with 40 golfers! Staff is also planning a November **Turkey Cup 2-Man Tournament** and holiday specials for the remainder of the season. The course hours will change to 9am – 5pm beginning on Monday, October 26<sup>th</sup>.
4. **Recreation Events**
  - Opening weekend of the **Hager House Ghost Tours** (Oct 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>) was a success! Eighty-eight (88) people signed up in advance online and 17 people registered on-site. The 8 p.m. tour was sold out both nights. Staff is planning for more tours this weekend and next.
  - **Anything But Golf** is scheduled at The Greens at Hamilton Run Golf Course (flyer attached) for this Saturday, October 24<sup>th</sup>. A fun recreational event for the entire family!
  - Plans for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual **Dog Costume Parade** are underway. Fifteen (15) prizes have been secured from local business and 6 exhibitors are confirmed for Saturday, October 31<sup>st</sup> from 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. Registration is open online.
5. **Fairgrounds Park.** We continue to trench and install 1100 feet of conduit to prepare for new electric service for the grandstand building.
6. **Safe Routes to School at Bester Elementary.** This project is now complete, although the State Highway says that two of the ramps need to be replaced as they slope more than ADA requirements. The cost to replace the ramps will be contractor's expense.
7. **Shentel/Sprint Contribution.** Shentel/Sprint generously donated \$12,000 towards the replacement purchase of playground equipment in City Park's south end. Also at City Park, employees from Shentel/Sprint volunteered their time and painted the caboose at the Train Museum and all the hand railing around the porch of the Mansion House. We feel honored that Shentel/Sprint chose us to be the recipient of their time and money.
8. **Reconstruction of Alley 3-36.** Construction has started on Alley 3-36 and is expected to take 2-3 weeks to complete. Letters have been delivered to adjacent residents.

### 2. REPORTS

- **10/14/15:** Officer Salahov responded to Central Avenue for a disturbance. The officer observed an intoxicated female shouting and disturbing the neighbors. She was advised to lower her voice. She became uncooperative and began to flee. Another officer was able to apprehend her and she was then placed under arrest and charged with Disturbing the Peace, Disorderly Conduct and Resisting Arrest.

- **10/19/15:** Officer Salahov responded to Freemont Street and Mitchell Avenue for a malicious destruction of property to a Mercedes. The vehicle had a broken front and rear windshield and both driver-side tires were punctured. The damage to the windshields was consistent with a baseball bat, and the tires were punctured with a knife or sharp object. No further information is available.

### 3. OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION

- **Congratulations:** Effective Monday, October 19, 2015, Officer Emily Daveler was certified for solo patrol. Officer Daveler has been assigned to the Patrol Division, Delta Platoon, under the command of Sgt. Andrew Lewis. Officer Daveler graduated from the Hagerstown Community College Police Academy in June 2015. We wish her well as she begins her police career at the Hagerstown Police Department.
- **Reassignment of Officer Ron Isaacs:** Effective Monday, October 19, 2015, Officer Isaacs has been reassigned to the Narcotics Task Force, under the command of Sgt. James Robison. Agent Isaacs will be involved in conducting narcotics investigations, cooperating with local, State and Federal law enforcement and criminal justice agencies in exchanging information and resources. He will be conducting surveillance operations to gather information for search and seizure warrants and raids. Agent Isaacs has been employed with the Hagerstown Police Department for eight years. We wish him well as he continues his police work with the Narcotics Task Force.

- Engineering Staff compiled the HLD Arc Resistant Clothing order and submitted to the successful vendors. HLD staff that are exposed to energized facilities are required to wear certain ratings of Arc Resistant Clothing to protect them against arc flashes. HLD provides an annual allotment to those employees.
- The Staff Engineer continued work regarding a new HLD line operations bucket truck bid as well as HLD's distribution transformer bid document(s).

**Administration**

- Staff reviewed an interconnection agreement with Potomac Edison. This agreement defines the five points of connection to the P.E. 34.5 kV subtransmission system for additions, upgrades, etc.
- The HLD roof job is coming to a close. The metal copings, flashing, and downspouts are all that remain to be completed.

**Water Production at R C Willson**

- The Phase IV work is nearing completion – Substantial Completion will be October 9<sup>th</sup> with Final Completion on November 9, 2015. Staff continues to work with the general contractor and the SCADA contractor to complete the SCADA upgrade.

- Operations
  - Operations were routine this week with operators assisting with the SCADA filter cut-over work. Staff also assisted with routine preventative maintenance and facility maintenance.
- Maintenance
  - Maintenance staff worked on routine preventive maintenance and continues to provide assistance with plant operations, as needed. Staff also assisted the SCADA contractor.
- Instrumentation
  - Instrumentation staff continues work with ABB on the new SCADA system.

**Water Production at Breichner**

- The Edgemont Reservoir pool elevation is -11.9 feet below crest and the bypass valve and the hydrant are closed to allow for natural fluctuation of the reservoir. Staff continues to work with Triad Engineering regarding the ongoing Study and seepage evaluation. Triad submitted the final draft of the study and this is currently under review by staff. The report includes cost estimates and a prioritized sequence for future work. Site evaluation is on-going to track and document seepage associated with recent precipitation and natural fluctuation of the reservoir.

**Water Distribution**

- Distribution crews are working on customer service, meter exchanges, meter testing and hydrant flushing throughout the system. Crews are also working with the City, County and the State on overlay projects and are planning on starting the new main replacement project on Diane Drive on October 26, 2015.

**Laboratory**
