PARKS & ENGINEERING

ENGINEERING DIVISION

1. **Left Turn Lane at Wilson/Summit** . The left-turn lane at Wilson Boulevard and Summit Avenue has been completed and the pavement markings are also complete. This was done to make the left turn safer.
2. **Federal Sub-Recipient Grant Training**. We attended training for the process and paperwork on Federally funded projects through State of Maryland, such as Safe Routes to School, ARC, and bridge funds.
3. **Antietam & Summit**. Construction of APS signal upgrade and handicap ramps continues, and is expected to be completed within the next two weeks.
4. **Dewey Avenue Neighborhoods 1st**. We prepared drawings and photos of the locations for proposed ornamental street name sign posts and will review with several members of the group this week.
5. **170 West Washington Street**. We did a walk through and found that the contractor has completed some of the items on the punch list but we are not pleased with their progress. We are discussing the issue with them.

PARKS & RECREATION DIVISION

1. **Ice Rink Update**. Some items of note from the May HIAAA Board Meeting:
 - The rink was a big winner in the recent "Washington County Gives" campaign as the rink netted approximately \$16,500 in donations ranking them #7 out of 73 nonprofits receiving money that day.
 - Major rink maintenance is forthcoming by the HIAAA and the ice will be taken out June 12-19 and we will be assisting them replacing the 20 year old chillers (which we paid 2/3 of the cost)
 - Total assets for the rink now top \$182,000.
 - Locker room project is 95% complete and should be usable next month.

- City will be installing automated door openers on the front doors on June 9th
- Parks and Rec will be provided a dasher board sign in exchange for advertising the rink at other City venues.

2. **Potterfield Pool.** Staff has been preparing for opening weekend this Saturday, May 28th at 12:30pm! Cashiers have been hired and trained, pool brochures have been distributed through the schools, program and sponsor banners have been sold and hung, and advertisements are running with What's NXT, Herald-Mail, Leitersburg Cinemas, and 102.1 More FM radio.

- Rent the pool for Private Parties - Pool is available for rental on Fridays (except for the first Friday of each month), from 7-9 p.m. and Saturdays & Sundays from 6-9 p.m.
- Register for Swim lessons! Ages 3-14. Lessons held Mondays-Thursdays; rain makeup on Fridays. Sessions begin June 13th and run through August 4th.
- Adult Fitness Swims will continue, Monday-Friday, from 7-8:30 a.m.
- New Aqua Programs:
 - Mommy and Me Swim Lessons. Two week sessions: June 13-23; July 11-21, 10-10:30 a.m. Developed for children six months to three years, Parent and Child Aquatics helps young children get ready to swim by emphasizing fun in the water. Parents and children participate in several guided practice sessions that help kids learn elementary swimming skills, including water entry, bubble blowing, front kicking, back floating, underwater exploration and more. Meets four days week. \$50/session.
- Water Aerobics
Four week sessions: June 13–July 8; July 11–August 4, 8-9 a.m.
Hop in the pool for a fun water workout! Water aerobics is the performance of aerobic exercise in a swimming pool and is a form of resistance training. Must be age 16 or older. Meets twice a week on Mondays and Wednesdays. \$50/session.

We are busy with building and grounds maintenance. Our pool management company has the water looking great and are actively cleaning each evening.

2. REPORTS

It should be noted the prescription has just been refilled. The officer will be filing charges on the visiting acquaintance.

05/21/16: Officer Weaver responded to Spot Laundromat on Salem Avenue for a disturbance. The manager of the business stated that there were customers in the building that she had requested to leave the premises and they refused. The manager further stated that the customers were allowing their children to throw litter on the floor and throw a ball against the machines. When the manager asked them to stop, the parents cursed at her. The manager requested a No Trespass Letter be served on the customers. The female customer refused to leave after several verbal requests by the officer. She was then transported to Central Booking and charged with Trespassing and Fail to Obey a Lawful Order.

3. **OTHER NEWS/INFORMATION: NATIONAL POLICE WEEK May 15–21, 2016**

The 21st Annual Public Safety Awards Ceremony was held on Tuesday, May 17, 2016 at the Hagerstown Community College to honor many deserving officers and employees. Congratulations to the following recipients being honored with special awards:

▶ **Certificate of Appreciation:** Officer Curtis Kelley & K9 Jacky for an alert to the odor of narcotics. Based on the scan, over 70 bags of heroin, cocaine and paraphernalia were recovered.

▶ **K9 Unit Citations:** In October of 2015, and for the first time since the creation of the Hagerstown Police Department's K9 Program, several members successfully passed the nation recognized North American Police Work Dog Association's certificate process. Also, for the first time in November of 2015, another member of the K9 unit successfully passed the Maryland State Police's Bloodhound Trailing certification process.

▶ **Delta Unit Citations:** On December 19, 2015, Officers from Delta Shift received a call for an armed robbery at the 7-11 on Dual Highway. Upon arrival, Officer Michael Biddle made contact with witnesses and received information that the suspect was on the move. Officers Jon Molineaux, Langley Dean and Jason Batistig were able to locate a suspect vehicle and stopped the vehicle on I-70. During the stop, probable cause was developed and two suspects were detained. Subsequent information was gathered and tied the suspects to other robberies in another jurisdiction. ▶ **1st Degree Award of Merit:** On March 14, 2016, officers responded to the Hampton Inn for reports of an active shooter in the hotel. Sgt. Wert, Officers Duane White, Jay McNew, Joshua Hostetter and Zachary McKoy entered a room, where the suspect was seen entering. The suspect was located in the room, hiding next to the bed. He then pointed a handgun at the officers, who gave commands to the suspect to show his hands. He was then taken into custody without injury to the officers or suspect. Due to their prompt response preventing injury to others in the hotel while placing them in personal danger, they were presented with the 1st Degree Merit Award.

- ▶ **Life Saving Award - Officer William Decker:** On December 14, 2015, Officer Decker responded to Culligan Water for a reported cardiac arrest call. He was directed to the warehouse area, where a male, later identified as John Phillip Stone Sr., was unresponsive. When Officer Decker arrived, two Hagerstown Public Works employees, Gary Seavolt and B.J. Zirkle, and Culligan Water employees, Charlie Chaney were conducting CPR on the victim. Officer Decker prepared his AED and took over CPR until CRS arrived and transported Mr. Stone to Meritus Medical Center.

- ▶ **Supervisor of the Year Award - Sgt. Mark Renner:** Sgt. Mark Renner has been with the Hagerstown Police Department since June of 1982 and the Department's most senior Sergeant, having been promoted to the rank on March 31, 1998. He has provided stellar leadership since his promotion and witnessed many changes within the Department. He has been dedicated to the Police Department, maintaining the last 18 years as a Sergeant in the Patrol Division. He has influenced, coached, and mentored, both new and established officers, more than any other active Sergeant. Sgt. Renner is a 34 year veteran who has maintained a consistent professional attitude throughout the years.

- ▶ **Officer of the Year Award & Life Saving Award - Officer Duane White:** On November 24, 2015, Officer White and DFC Damian Broussard responded to a call for service for a medical emergency involving a 13 year old male who was not breathing. It was determined that the male became unresponsive while being transported by family members to Meritus Medical Center. Officer White and Deputy Broussard performed CPR on the male and regained a pulse. The attending physician at Meritus Medical Center advised that without their quick response, the 13 year old male would probably not have survived. Based on the lifesaving measures performed during this incident, both Officer White and DFC Damian Broussard were honored with a Lifesaving Award. Officer White also received the Officer of the Year Award for this medical emergency.

- ▶ **Outstanding Civilians of the Year – Ami Reed and Louise Kitchen:** Ami Reed has been with the Hagerstown Police Department since June of 2006 as HPD's Building Maintenance Worker. Louise Kitchen has been with the Hagerstown Police Department since December of 2007 as HPD's part-time Building Maintenance Worker.

 Ami and her mother, Louise, take pride in their work and are always ready to go above and beyond to assist the employees of the Hagerstown Police Department. Their dedication, loyalty, and knowledge have proven invaluable to the Hagerstown Police Department.


