FIRE DEPARTMENT

1. **2052 Day Road House Fire:** Hagerstown Fire Department and Funkstown Volunteer Fire Department responded at approximately 5:45 pm for a reported house fire on Day Road. Units arrived with heavy fire visible from the front and sides of the dwelling. The fire was extinguished around 7 p.m. The actual address was not given when the call was initially dispatched, it was later determined that the property is outside Hagerstown City limits. Units remained on the scene to support the investigation by the Maryland State Fire Marshal and Hagerstown City Fire Marshal’s office. The final units cleared the scene at approximately 1:30 a.m.
2. **After-Fire-Neighborhood Community Risk Reduction Visits:** Wednesday, February 10th, members of the Hagerstown Fire Department canvassed the neighborhood around the 400 block of West Washington Street, where an apartment fire occurred on February 4th displacing five people. Firefighters went door-to-door on West Franklin, George, High and Wise streets, visiting over 200 homes to share fire prevention information and install smoke alarms, if needed. The Fire Department encourages residents to check their smoke alarms monthly.

3. **440 West Washington Street Apartment Fire:** Hagerstown Fire Department and Washington County units which were transferred to the City fire stations during the Day Road fire were alerted for an apartment fire with occupants trapped at 440 West Washington Street. Units arrived to find fire showing from the back and side of the two story apartment building. Two occupants were assisted by firefighters from the building. They were later transported by Community Rescue Service to the hospital where they were treated and released. Four firefighters also sustained minor injuries during the incident. The Hagerstown City Fire Marshal's office has determined that the fire originated in the kitchen and was caused by an overloaded electric power strip.

2. **REPORTS**

- 02/04/16: Officer Cline was dispatched to West Franklin Street for the report of a burglary. The victim stated that someone has taken her flat screen TV from her residence. Water Production at R C Willson

- The Phase IV work has reached final completion and staff continues reviewing project close-out documentation. Staff submitted the final Change Order to MDE for review and approval and will submit this Change Order to Mayor and Council in February.

- Operations
 - Operations were routine this week - staff worked on facility maintenance and routine preventative maintenance. Staff isolated and cleaned the 16" gate valve in the low service area. Water demand continues to be high for this time of year.
- Maintenance
 - Maintenance staff worked on routine preventive maintenance and continues to provide assistance with plant operations, as needed. Staff assisted with the low service gate valve work.
- Instrumentation
 - Instrumentation staff continues work with ABB on the SCADA system. Work is ongoing for the lighting and heating system in the Chlorine rooms. Staff began work on replacing the Chlorine scales – the existing scales are in poor condition and will be replaced.

Water Production at Breichner

- The Edgemont Reservoir is currently 0.2 feet below crest and the bypass valve and the hydrant are open. Site evaluation is on-going to track and document seepage associated with recent precipitation and natural fluctuation of the reservoir.

Water Distribution

- Distribution crews are working throughout the system performing customer service work as needed. Crews have been installing new meters, testing meters, and reading fire line meters throughout our system. A leak was repaired a leak on Roxbury Road.
