ENGINEERING & PERMITS

1. **Marsh Run Wall Repairs** – a pre-bid meeting was held for this project to repair failing masonry wall sections on the Marsh Run aqueduct along Memorial Blvd. Due to permit restrictions, this work will probably be delayed until June 2026.
2. **MKS Business Park Stormwater Retrofit** – the contractor is performing final grading on the embankment of the pond, and we hope to complete this project before the end of the calendar year.
3. **Reimagining Dual Highway** – Engineering staff, along with staff from the Department of Planning & Economic Development, participated in a virtual meeting with business owners and others to discuss ways to improve the Dual Highway corridor and make it more appealing to businesses and their customers.



Significant Events

November 6 – 355 South Potomac Street – Building Fire – HFD companies responded for a reported building fire. On arrival they found a fire burning on the 2nd floor exterior roof decking. Fire was quickly contained, and damage was limited to area of origin. Fire cause is under investigation, there were no injuries, and minor water damage to the business on the ground floor.



November 11 – HFD Engines 2 and 3 were dispatched to the area across from 304 Chimneystone Ct for a reported house on fire with entrapment. Engine 2 was first arriving, finding a single-story residence with a large volume of fire evident through the roof of the structure. It was quickly confirmed that there was in fact an occupant trapped inside. Engine 2, Engine 3, and Longmeadow units entered the structure for fire attack and searching for the trapped victim. Conditions rapidly deteriorated and crews were ordered to evacuate the structure. The fire was then controlled from the outside and crews eventually found a deceased person inside. Units were on scene until the early morning hours on Wednesday.



Community Events

November 10 – Potomac Towers Tenants Meeting – Personnel from the Fire Marshals Office and fire companies met with residents and Hagerstown Housing Authority at Potomac Towers to discuss the recent fire, expected actions of tenants, general fire safety, and expectations of the HFD in the event of a fire or fire alarm in the building.

Training

November 5, 6 – HFD Trench Rescue Technicians conducted refresher training with Washington County Division of Emergency Services as part of the combined Special Operations Team.



November 10 – Crews conducted vehicle extrication training simulating a vehicle hanging without traditional access, and the need to utilize rope systems to cut and remove pieces of the vehicle to remove patients.






A & E PARKING GARAGE OCCUPANCY
