

Lodging Facilities Licensing Program - 2025

The second year of this program required inspections at all Tier 2 hotels from 2024. Tier 1 hotels from 2024 were exempt from the inspection in 2025. The inspections this year were performed by the City Code Administration staff and Fire Department staff. The inspections this year determined the Tier Status for the 2025 year. Depending upon the results of the inspections, hotels were classified as Tier 1 or Tier 2 hotels. Tier 2 status indicates the inspection found more than or equal to 0.25 code violations per room for the property. The hotels are required to post the license in the lobby with the code violations per room number identified.

Part of the program requires the following by the hotels:

- Abatement of all prior revealed code violations prior to renewal of the license.
- Maintenance of a guest registry.
- Certification of completion of training by hotel staff of Overdose Response Program Training by the Washington County Health Department.
- Certification of completion of annual training by hotel staff of Human Trafficking Training, as required by State code.
